## EPSCoR Grants Awarded To Area Schools

Six schools across South Dakota, including area districts and cooperatives, will share \$200,000 to enhance, expand, and develop new opportunities in secondary career cluster programs.

The money comes from the Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR) program.

EPSCoR funds were awarded to Black Hills State University, East Dakota Educational Cooperative, Edgemont School District, Mid-Central Educational Cooperative, Platte-Geddes School District and the Vermillion School District.

The funded projects will focus on the following career clusters: science, technology, engineering and math; information technology; health science; and agriculture science.

Projects range from dual credit opportunities in information technology to cutting-edge courses in pre-engineering and biosciences.

### Dakota Daughters To Perform In Yankton

The Dakota Daughters will present "Wounded Knee: Three Lives, Three Women, Three Stories" at 2 p.m. today (Tuesday) at Avera Sacred Heart Majestic Bluffs and at 10 a.m. Wednesday, Sept. 16 at The Center.

The trio — made up of Geraldine Goes In Center, Lillian Witt and Joyce Jefferson — give an interpretation of the events leading up to the massacre at Wounded Knee Creek in 1890. Goes In Center portrays Sitting Bull's daughter, Witt portrays Sadie Babcock (a rancher's wife) and Jefferson portrays Mattie Elmira Richardson (engaged to a Buffalo soldier).

These events are free and open to the public.

The panel discussion will feature Amine El Idrissi (Arabic and native of Morocco), Ghada Mahdi (Education and native of Iraq) and Nagla Kamel (Medical School and native of Egypt). The moderator will be Dr. Benno Wymar (Economics).

### S.D. Seeks Disaster Declaration For July

PIERRE — Gov. Mike Rounds has requested a presidential disaster declaration to help 12 South Dakota counties recover from damages caused by heavy rainfall, severe storms and widespread flooding in late July.

The request is for public assistance for Beadle, Brule, Clay, Fall River, Hand, Jerauld, Lincoln, Minnehaha, Miner, Sanborn, Turner and Union counties. Total damage to public infrastructure in those counties is estimated to be more than \$4 million from heavy rains and severe storms during the period between July 21-30.

The request is a necessary step for federal disaster funds to be made available to South Dakota. If the President grants the declaration, up to 75 percent of eligible costs could be reimbursed by the federal government. The governor's request does not guarantee federal funding will be made available to South Dakota.

#### CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures rose Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery added 8.25 cents to \$7.45 a bushel; December corn climbed 5.25 cents to \$4.85 a bushel; and December oats rose 9 cents to \$3.33 a bushel. Soybeans for November delivery gained 3.5 cents to 10.345 a bushel.

Beef futures rose while pork futures traded flat or lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

October live cattle added 0.30 cent to 97.45 cents a pound; October feeder cattle rose 0.55 cent to \$1.1237 a pound; October lean hogs dropped 0.95 cent to 76.30 cents a pound; and February pork bellies were flat at \$1.0580 a pound.
