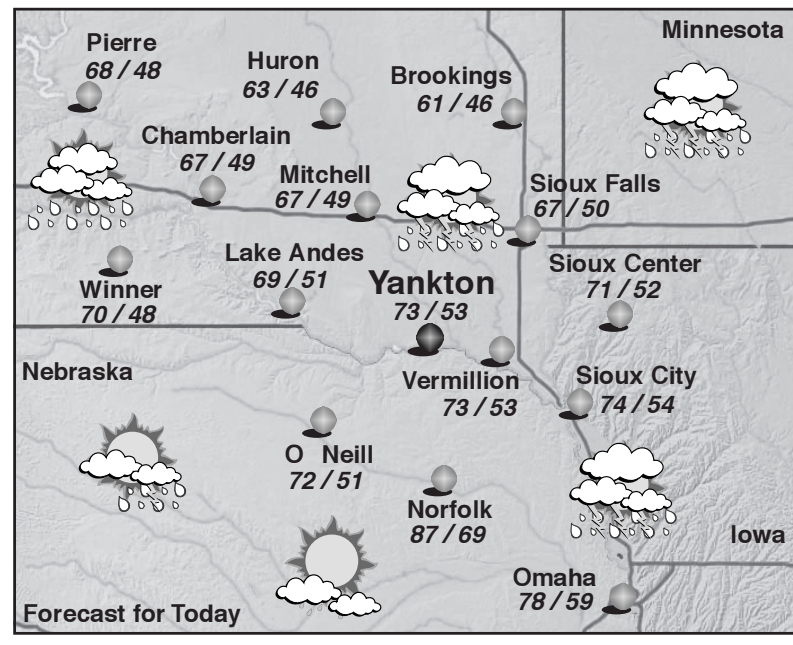

Dakota Daughters To Perform In Yankton

Due to incorrect information provided to the Press & Dakotan, the dates for the performances of the Dakota Daughters in Yankton, published in Tuesday's edition, were incorrect. The Dakota Daughters will present "Wounded Knee: Three Lives, Three Women, Three Stories" at 2 p.m. today (Wednesday) at Avera Sacred Heart Majestic Bluffs and at 10 a.m. Thursday at The Center. The trio — made up of Geraldine Goes In Center, Lillian Witt and Joyce Jefferson — give an interpretation of the events leading up to the massacre at Wounded Knee Creek in 1890. Goes In Center portrays Sitting Bull's daughter, Witt portrays Sadie Babcock (a rancher's wife) and Jefferson portrays Mattie Elmira Richardson (engaged to a Buffalo soldier). These events are free and open to the public.

A Fly-In/Drive-In Breakfast will be held at Chan Gurney Municipal Airport in Yankton on Sunday, Sept. 19, running from 8 a.m.-1 p.m. The breakfast is sponsored by Yankton Regional Aviation Association (YRAA). CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Wheat futures fell, but other grains prices rose Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery fell 9 cents to \$7.36 a bushel; December corn climbed 11.5 cents to \$4.95 a bushel; and December oats jumped 11.5 cents to \$3.445 a bushel. Soybeans for November delivery added 1 cent to \$10.355 a bushel. Beef and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle added 0.75 cent to 98.20 cents a pound; October feeder cattle dipped 0.27 cent to \$1.1210 a pound; October lean hogs gained 2.4 cents to 78.70 cents a pound; and February pork bellies were flat at \$1.0580 a pound.

Club To Receive \$425,000

WASHINGTON — The Boys and Girls Club of the Missouri River in Wagner will receive the \$425,000 earmark, the office of Sen. Tim Johnson has announced. Johnson is a member of the Senate Appropriations Committee.

The funding is from the Fiscal Year 2010 Department of Commerce, Justice, Science and Related Agencies Appropriations Bill and will be used to purchase equipment and supplies.

Earmarks like this are federal funding secured by members of Congress, enabling them to support high-priority projects in their home states. Each member of Congress' ability to deliver earmarks for their state varies depending on their seniority, committee assignments, and other factors.
