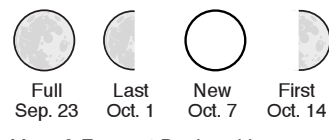

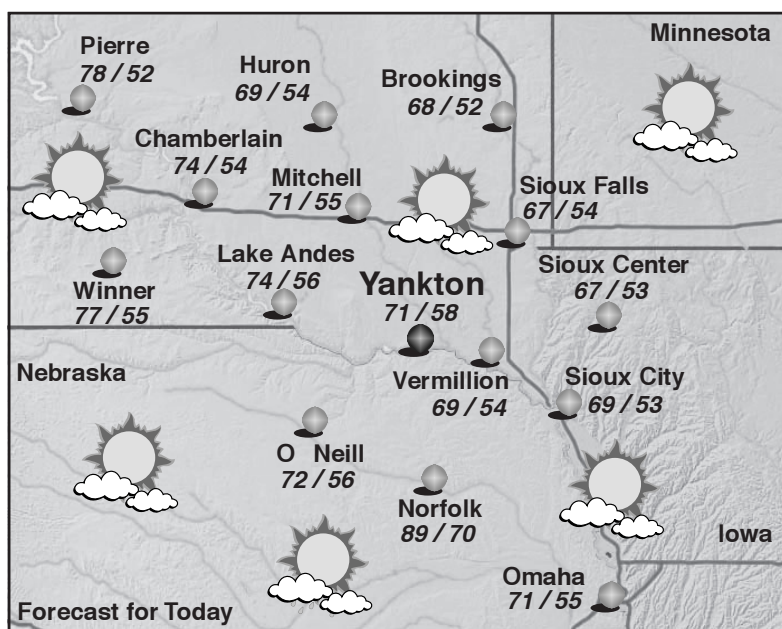

CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains prices traded mixed Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery fell 9.25 cents to \$7.2675 a bushel; December corn inched up 0.25 cent to \$4.9525 a bushel; December oats slid 4.5 cents to \$3.40 a bushel; while soybeans for November delivery added 7 cents to \$10.425 a bushel. Beef futures dropped while pork futures rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle dipped 0.08 cent to 98.12 cents a pound; October feeder cattle shed 0.60 cent to \$1.1150 a pound; October lean hogs gained 0.55 cent to 79.25 cents a pound; and February pork bellies added 0.22 cent to \$1.0602 a pound.

Uranium Mining Speech At U. Tues.

VERMILLION — Charmaine White Face will speak about "The Impacts of Uranium Mining on South Dakota" Tuesday, Sept. 21, from 7-9 p.m. in the Freedom Forum Conference Room, Al Neuharth Center, University of South Dakota, in Vermillion. White Face is founder of Defenders of the Black Hills, an organization whose purpose is to preserve, protect, and restore the environment of the 1868 Treaty Territory. Among other activities, the organization seeks the remediation of hundreds of abandoned open-pit uranium mines, and thousands of uncap, unfilled, and unmarked uranium exploratory wells that contaminate the region with high levels of uranium and other radioactive pollutants. White Face was educated as a biologist and physical scientist, and has worked as a journalist and writer. She received the Nuclear-Free Future Award in the category of Resistance from the Franz Moll Foundation for the Coming Generations at the 10th annual

Nuclear Free Future Awards ceremony held in Salzburg, Austria, on Oct. 18, 2007. Central to her message is that all of us are threatened by radioactive waste. Radioactive dust is carried by the wind and interconnects waterways, and toxic poisons in the soil work their way into the mainstream food chain. The Living River Group Sierra Club and the South Dakota Humanities Council are sponsoring the lecture/discussion.
