this year. Most economists think Americans will spend at about the same pace, or only slightly better, in the current quarter.

By contrast, after the 1981-82 recession, consumer spending averaged a robust 6.5 percent pace during 1983.

"Consumer spending is going to show only stunted growth this year because the wherewithal to spend — jobs, income, wealth — are only inching higher," said Ken Mayland, president of ClearView Economics.

Another reason shoppers are unlikely to ramp up their spending: Their faith in the economy is sagging. Consumer confidence dropped in September, according to the University of Michigan/Reuters' consumer sentiment index fell released Friday.

Police Say USD Campus, Community Not At Risk From Sexual Assault Case

VERMILLION — While the investigation into a recent sexual assault on the University of South Dakota campus is still ongoing, Vermillion Captain Chad Passick said there is no longer any danger to the campus or the community.

"We learned this was not an incident of a stranger attack, so we feel comfortable saying there isn't a risk to the community at this time," he said.

USD's Department of Public Safety received a call at 4:32 a.m. Sunday about an incident of a sexual assault at Richardson Hall. DPS then turned the investigation over to the Vermillion Police Department.

Passick said the VPD does have a suspect in the investigation.

"At this point, we have somebody who has been named, or alleged to be a suspect," he said. "But we don't have anyone that we would call a suspect in the crime."

Passick said he doesn't know if alcohol was involved or what kind of interaction took place.

"That's all part of the investigation, determining the types of interaction. Anytime you investigate that, you determine what happened during any possible interaction," he said.
