

Round-The-Globe Sailor Dodge Morgan Dies At 78

PORTLAND, Maine (AP) — Dodge Morgan, who became the first American to sail solo around the globe without stopping — and did it in record time — has died of complications from cancer. He was 78.

Morgan, who died Tuesday at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, turned his small marine radar company into the successful Whistler brand of detectors before sailing around the world. Hobbs Funeral Home in South Portland is handling the arrangements and confirmed the death.

treat Yankton's injured athletes.

"I'm employed by the hospital, which donates my services to the school. The school only pays for supplies: tape, gauze, ice, etc.," Woods said. "I come into the high school between early

to mid afternoon to help start treatments with kids and help get athletes ready for practice."

Woods is at every Yankton football game, as well as home games for varsity and sub-varsity sports, and varsity practices.

While most of his work is the treatment of injuries, he also works with athletes who have suffered injuries in the past, making sure they are doing the work necessary to remain healthy.
