Volleyball: Tulsa Tops USD 3-0

FARGO, N.D. — The University of South Dakota volleyball team displayed improved play on Friday but fell short against Tulsa at the Doublebunch Inn Classic, losing in three sets, 25-19, 25-10, 25-22 in Fargo, N.D.

The match was second of the event hosted by North Dakota State. USD (2-12) battled tough in the first and third sets against Tulsa (7-2), which returns four starters and the libero from last year's 26-7 team.

The first set stayed close much of the way. USD held a 13-12 lead after a Tulsa error, but the Golden Hurricane battled back to take a 19-15 lead. The Coyotes got within 19-16 after a kill from freshman Tori Kroll, but were unable to close the gap further in a 25-19 setback.

In the second set, USD struggled with passing and fell behind 18-6 and never recovered in a 25-10 loss. In the third set, the Coyotes rebounded and led much of the way. USD held an 18-16 lead after a kill by freshman Natalie Walseth, and moments later, pushed the lead to 20-17 after senior Kristin Kritebrink put down a kill.

The set was tied at 22-22 but Tulsa got three straight kills from standout Tyler Henderson -- who had 23 kills -- to finish the set with a 25-22 win.

Kritebrink paced USD with 12 kills, while Walseth, freshman Emily Olsen and junior Tahnee Reed added five each. USD hit .170 as a team with just 16 errors in the match. Kroll had 28 set assists and four kills to go with 10 digs, while Kritebrink also chipped in with 10 digs.

The Coyotes resume action at the classic today (Saturday) with two matches. USD plays North Dakota in a nonconference match at 11 a.m. and concludes with a match against South Dakota State at 7:30 p.m.

The Jacks outshot the Panthers 23-7, including 11-3 on-goal. The Jacks, now 3-1-3 overall, continue their home stand with Eastern Washington Sunday at 1 p.m. at Fishback Soccer Park.
