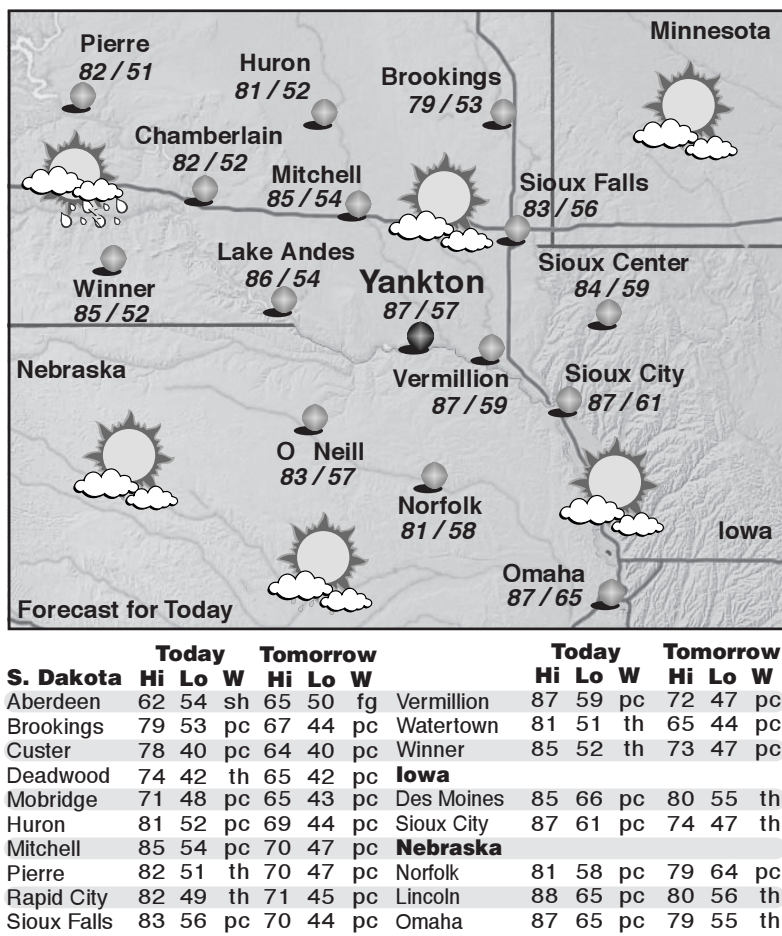

tion by both union organizers and company management. "The whole concept behind secret ballots is to avoid any possibility of intimidation or threat. I think that's very important in our system to preserve that secret ballot right," Knudson said. "I think it's not anti-union. It's pro-worker." Anderson said only 6.6 percent of South Dakota workers are represented by a union, but the proposal would make it more difficult for workers to form unions and bargain for better wages, better benefits and safer working conditions. South Dakota workers now earn well below the national average, he said.

demented to be against self-defense and resource stewardship." Prior to Nugent's speech, more focus was put on what is being called the "NFAA Easton Yankton Olympic Pursuit." "What we've seen here today is the culmination of a lot of different partnerships," said Yankton City Manager Doug Russell. Greg Easton of the Easton Sports Development Foundation, which has contributed large sums of money to Yankton's archery complex, said the effort is a natural fit for his organization. "Our focus ... is to help develop competitive archery," he said. "We want to help create that next Olympic gold medalist to come out of the U.S., hopefully — and even out of Yankton, possibly." The United States Olympic Committee has partnered with sports groups across the nation to create a handful of CODPs that provide training in fencing, weightlifting, judo and a variety of other activities. None of them offer archery. "My goal is, in 2016 some-

Proposals similar to the South Dakota amendment are on ballots in several other states. Anderson said the amendment is not needed because the South Dakota Constitution already has a provision that protects secret ballots. That language requires the Legislature to pass a law to "insure secrecy in voting." Knudson said the proposed amendment would provide clearer language to specify that a secret ballot relates to political and labor elections. Anderson said Congress may never pass the union-organizing bill, so the South Dakota ballot measure seeks to block something that may never become federal law. However, the Chamber of Commerce argues on its website that defeated or retiring lawmakers

might pass the measure when Congress meets after the November election, before newly elected House and Senate members take office in January. The National Labor Relations Board also might try to impose the union-organizing provisions as a rule instead of a law, the Chamber of Commerce said. Anderson said if the ballot measure passes, it would likely be struck down in a court challenge because federal law would preempt a state measure. That would stick South Dakota taxpayers with the bill for a lawsuit the state would lose, he said. Knudson said it's not clear whether federal law would preempt a state constitutional provision that deals with a procedural right relating to the process used by workers to designate or authorize unions.
