# Competition For Young Writers Planned

PIERRE — Have you ever read a book and been inspired to write something of your own? The South Dakota State Historical Society (SDSHS) Press is hoping that the Prairie Tale Series will do just that for South Dakota's first-to-fifth graders.

To celebrate release of the fifth Prairie Tale, "The Enchanted Buffalo," which is available Sept. 25, the SDSHS Press is holding a competition to find the best story and illustration inspired by the Prairie Tales for each of the five elementary school grades.

To enter the writing competition, children should use the characters, history and settings from one of the Prairie Tales as inspira-

tion and write their own "prairie tales." The stories should be set in the same historical era — each story was written in the early 1900s — as that in the original book. Students can enter as individuals or as part of classroom efforts.

The art competition will follow the same format as the writing competition. One piece of Prairie-Tale-inspired art should be submitted. The piece should be original, depicting a scene other than those shown by the illustrations in the book.

The competition opens Sept. 27 and closes Feb. 28, 2011. At that time, winners will be chosen for each grade in both writing and

illustration, and three complete sets of the Prairie Tales (5 books in each set) will be awarded — one to the winning child, and two to the school. (If the winning entry comes from a class rather than an individual, all three sets will be awarded to the school.) Winning entries in both the story and art categories will have their work "published" online at [www.prairie-tale.com](http://www.prairie-tale.com).

It was their first time at Ribfest.

"We thought it would be something different to do this afternoon," Linda said. "The food is very good."

The weather didn't have an impact on Saturday afternoon's "Walk A Mile In Her Shoes" event, according to Desiree Slaba, executive director of the Yankton Women's and Children's Shelter.

The event raises money for and awareness of domestic violence issues, and draws dozens of men wearing high heels and drag.

About 70 men participated this year and raised approximately \$14,000. That was down from nearly \$20,000 raised last year.

"We didn't have any expectations, just because we've been asking the community for

so much with the new (Women's and Children's Center)," Slaba said. "The \$14,000 is just tremendous. Thank you to everyone who participated and their willingness to create awareness."

The challenge facing Ribfest next year will be recruiting new leadership, Huff said. A handful of committee members who have been involved the past four years intend to step down. Huff is among them.

"There are probably four or five of us on the committee who are done," he said. "It's time for new people to take over."

Yankton will be behind whoever takes the reins, Huff stated.

"People really want Ribfest to work," he said. "We've just got to find people who will drive the train to take it over for those who have driven it for four years. Hopefully, there will be a couple of hard chargers. If it can stay true to its purpose, I'm sure the community will support it like it's done every year."
