50 YEARS AGO

Wednesday, Sept. 21, 1960

- Needs of the Yankton State Hospital were outlined to legislators and candidates for the legislature from a seven-county area in southeastern South Dakota by Dr. Lawrence G. Behan, superintendent, Tuesday night. The outline said an increase in funds for salaries, additional staff and other operating expenses is more important to the hospital than any of the special requests for new buildings or repair of old buildings.
- The controversial subject of birth control has recently reached such widespread and alarming proportions in overpopulated countries like India that it may become a specific problem for the next President of the United States, directly or indirectly.
