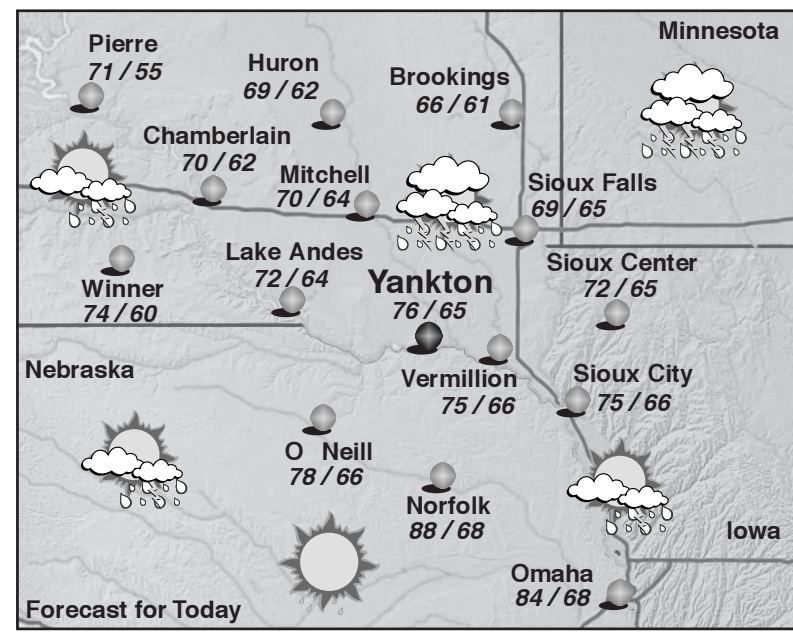

Vermillion Police To Hold Rx Collection

VERMILLION — Residents will have the opportunity to dispose of unwanted medications during a National Prescription Drug Take-Back event being held in Vermillion Saturday.

The Vermillion Police Department will take part in the campaign being spearheaded by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

The collection will occur from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday at the Vermillion Police Department, located at 15 Washington St. The DEA makes clear that:

- the program is anonymous;
- prescription and over-the-counter solid dosage medications, i.e. tablets and capsules, are accepted;
- intra-venous solutions, injectables and needles will not be accepted; and
- illicit substances such as marijuana or methamphetamine are not a part of the initiative.

CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures fell Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery dropped 13.75 cents to \$7.18 a bushel; December corn shed 3 cents to \$5.0525 a bushel; December oats fell 7.5 cents to \$3.515 a bushel; while soybeans for November delivery slid 4.5 cents to \$10.80 a bushel. Beef and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle shed 0.65 cent to 97.50 cents a pound; October feeder cattle fell 0.10 cent to \$1.065 a pound; October lean hogs added 0.78 cent to 79.30 cents a pound; while February pork bellies were flat at \$1.0850 a pound.

Healthcare Workforce Grants Awarded

PIERRE — The South Dakota Healthcare Workforce Partnership Fund has awarded its third year of grants. Six educational agencies and five health facilities will share \$93,333 in grant funds to support workforce projects ranging from the development of a training program for certified nurse assistants to the creation of camps that allow high school students to explore health careers.

"South Dakota's population is aging, baby boomers in healthcare are retiring and there are fewer high school graduates to replace them which means we're facing critical needs for workers across the healthcare industry," said Halley Lee, manager of the

South Dakota Healthcare Workforce Center for the Department of Health. "Facilities across the state are working hard to recruit and retain healthcare workers and to promote health careers to our students still in school. The partnership fund was created to provide some support for those efforts."

The South Dakota Healthcare Workforce Partnership Fund was established in conjunction with the South Dakota Community Foundation to support innovative healthcare workforce projects in the state. Substantial financial support was provided by Avera Health, Regional Health and Sanford Health. Recipients of this year's grants include:

- Sanford Vermillion Medical Center, \$10,000 to host a healthcare career summer camp for up to 50 participants
- University of South Dakota, \$9,930 to use resident physicians and medical students to lead eighth grade students in a class exploring careers in different health care disciplines during the 2010-2011 academic year
- Vermillion School District, \$10,000 to develop a program of study for students interested in health science careers with dual credit, shadowing and internship opportunities.
