first year, having close to 2,000. But we had a 10 percent increase at least for the second year," which we felt was very good," she said. "We're definitely on track to do the same thing (this year)."

Along with the jump in participation, the amount of funds raised has also increased — and that's a good thing for South Dakota, Abbott said.

"Seventy-five percent of the money raised stays right here, and is decided by a grants committee of professional people ... that know how to award grants appropriately," she said. "They're not just giving it to anybody. They make sure they fit the mission that we are involved in. It doesn't happen haphazardly."

The remaining 25 percent goes toward a national grant program, from which South Dakota has received more than \$600,000, Rhoades said.

Although the event is still new for this state, it has existed

since 1982. Named for Susan G. Komen, who died of breast cancer, the program has invested more than \$1 billion in research and treatment since its inception.

"We're amongst approximately 129 races throughout the world," Abbott said. "This is not just a South Dakota or United States run — it is a global event."

It's something everyone should take part in, she said. "To see all the survivors in one place — all in pink — is inspiring," Abbott said. "They're doing what they can to help fight breast cancer right here in South Dakota."

Rhoades agreed. "I think it's important for all people to support this cause," she said. "I personally will be in the event in honor of one of my younger sisters, who had breast cancer, and in memory of my best friend, who died 7 1/2 years ago. I'm walking for my daughter, my granddaughter, my mother, my sisters and for all women."

scene was necessary in order to execute the search warrant," the court wrote.

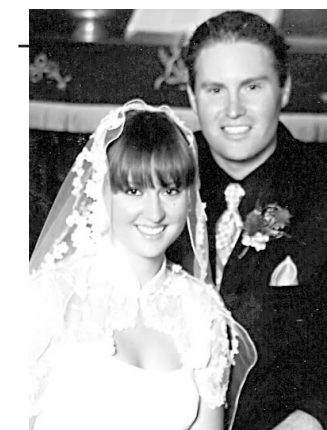
A call to the Lykkens' attorney, David Hosner, was not immediately returned.

died in April 2008, and Thom is also listed in a case footnote as a special administrator of his estate.

Also named were Crystal Brady of the Vermillion Police Department and Mike Buchholz of the Union County Sheriff's Office.

State prosecutors dropped the criminal charges against David Lykken after a fellow inmate, Aloysius Black Crow, acknowledged having another prisoner pose as David Lykken to make secret recordings of a supposed confession to the crime.
