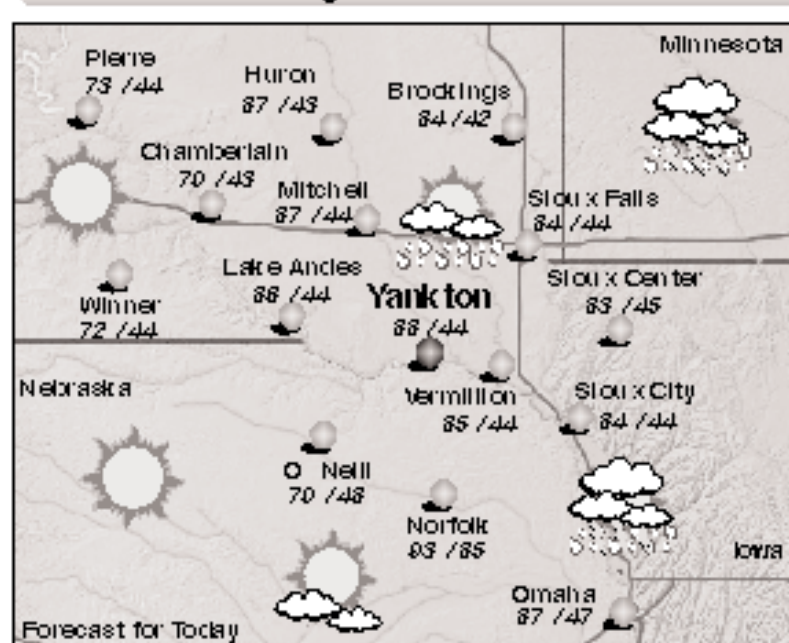

### Cedar Co. Conducting Emergency Drill Today

RANDOLPH, Neb. — Emergency responders from throughout Cedar County, Neb., will come together today (Saturday) and respond to a large mock emergency.

The 10:30 a.m. drill, held across from Randolph (Neb.) High School, will serve as the county's full-scale disaster exercise of 2010, said Cedar County emergency manager Kevin Garvin.

"Responders will be summoned to the scene of a mock accident involving a car that has collided with a train carrying hazardous materials across the street from the high school," he said.

"It will be up to (emergency personnel) to respond appropriately to the situation, treat all of the victims and perform evacuation if necessary (because of) the hazardous materials involved."

The exercise is designed to simulate a situation that could happen in all reality and provide responders the opportunity to sharpen their skills prior to an actual occurrence, Garvin said.

All fire, emergency medical services and law enforcement agencies within Cedar County have been invited to participate, Garvin said. An invitation has also been extended to the Nebraska State Patrol, Cedar County emergency management, Cedar County roads department, Mercy Air Care, Lifenet Air Medical, Randolph Public Schools and Nebraska Northeastern Railways.

"Responding to emergencies is nothing new to emergency responders," Garvin said. "But with today's busy lifestyle, seldom do they get the opportunity to work with other agencies to practice their skills for large emergencies."

"Cedar County Emergency Management is providing them the opportunity to do just that."

### Centerville Woman Up For House Candidacy

CENTERVILLE — Patricia Norin of Centerville has announced her candidacy for the House of Representatives in Pierre, representing District 17 which includes Turner and Clay counties.

**GRAINS FUTURES JUMP, LIVE-STOCK PRICES TRADE MIXED**  
 CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures rose Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.  
 Wheat for December delivery jumped 22.75 cents to \$7.20 a bushel; December corn soared 22.5 cents to \$5.2175 bushel; December oats added 14 cents to \$3.52 a bushel; while soybeans for November delivery gained 32.5 cents to \$11.26 a bushel.  
 Beef and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.  
 December live cattle shed 0.13 cent to 98.12 cents a pound; November feeder cattle dropped 0.75 cent to \$1.0910 a pound; December lean hogs added 0.43 cent to 76.45 cents a pound; while February pork bellies were flat at \$1.0850 a pound.

## Bridge Collapses Near Lake Byron

HURON (AP) — A wood and steel bridge on a county road near Lake Byron in eastern South Dakota has collapsed.

Beadle County Emergency Manager Tom Moeding said Friday that officials don't know why the bridge over Foster Creek in the northwest corner of Lake Byron collapsed. The lake is about 15 miles northeast of Huron.

Moeding told KOK-AM someone reported Friday morning the bridge was sagging. An official went out to the bridge and stopped traffic that was trying to cross it.

Moeding says a short time after traffic was rerouted, the bridge split in the middle and fell in the creek.

Moeding says an engineer will evaluate the bridge to determine why it fell.

The bridge could be out for a year or more before repairs can be made.
