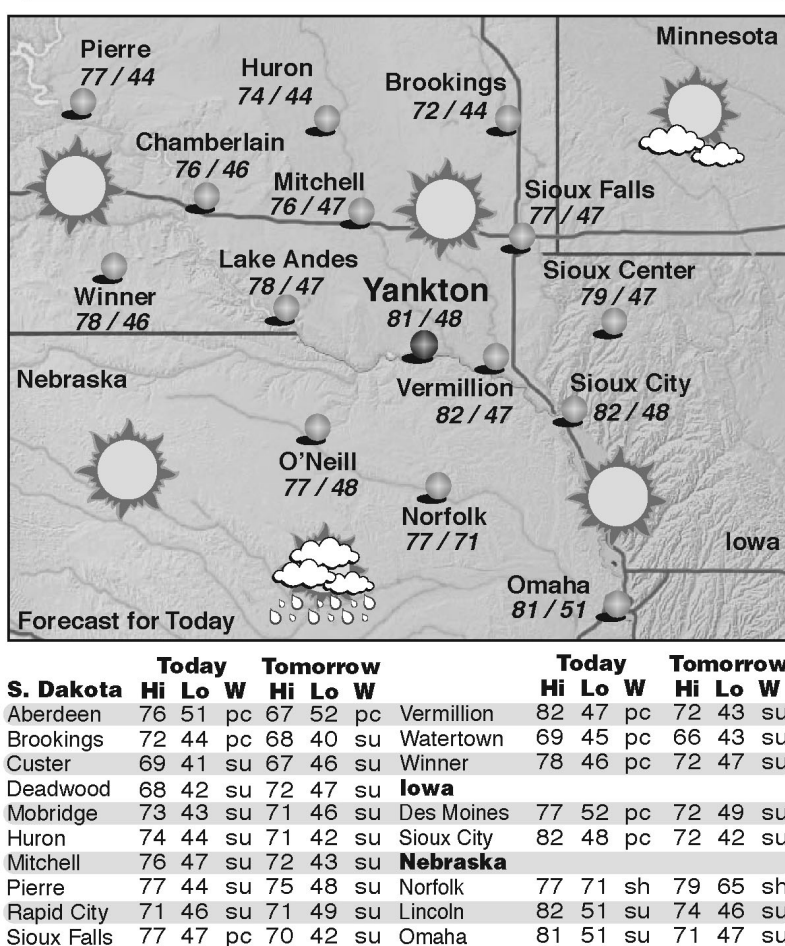

 The cornerstone of the new junior college building on the grounds of Sacred Heart convent was laid Sunday morning in the north wall of the main entrance on the east side of the building, after having been blessed by Father Ignatius, chaplain of the convent.

### 50 YEARS AGO

**Friday, Sept. 30, 1960**  
 A Rapid City man escaped without a scratch, officials said, when his light plane flipped on landing at Moberge airport Wednesday. J.W. Bender was coming in for a landing in his single-engine plane when the nosewheel hit a ditch being bladed at the edge of the runway.  
 The plane flipped and was damaged extensively, but Bender was unhurt. Argentine investigators were advised today that the German-born laborer who looks like Martin Bormann is not Hitler's missing deputy. But there was still mystery about the suspect's background. Interior Minister Alfredo Vitolo, in a post-midnight news conference, said the explanations given by the one-armed suspect were not satisfactory.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures mostly fell Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.  
 Wheat for December delivery dropped 1.25 cents to \$6.835 a bushel; December corn added 5 cents to \$5.05 bushel; December oats shed 2.5 cents to \$3.355 a bushel; and soybeans for November delivery slid 11 cents to \$10.99 a bushel.  
 Beef and pork futures traded flat or lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.  
 December live cattle dropped 0.73 cent to 98.57 cents a pound; November feeder cattle fell 0.80 cent to \$1.0980 a pound; December lean hogs slid 2.05 cents to 73.85 cents a pound; while February pork bellies were flat at \$1.0850 a pound.
