**Earnhardt Signs Five-Year Extension With Hendrick**  
CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — NASCAR's most popular driver will stay with the most dominant race team at least through 2017. Hendrick Motorsports on Thursday announced a five-year contract extension with Dale Earnhardt Jr., who heads to Atlanta Motor Speedway this weekend trying to clinch his first berth in the Chase for the Sprint Cup cham-

ampionship in three years. "It's great to have it all wrapped up so quickly and far in advance," said Earnhardt, who had another year left on the original contract that began in 2008. "Rick and I were on the same page from the first time we talked about it, so there wasn't any sense in waiting. There were never any questions or

hesitations from either of us. It was just, 'Yeah, let's do it.' Earnhardt left Dale Earnhardt Inc., his late father's race team, at the end of the 2007 season to join car owner Rick Hendrick. Earnhardt's courtship was the most frenzied free agent in NASCAR history, and he chose the most dominant team in the Sprint Cup Series.

## Ex-Viking Senser's SUV Linked To Fatal Hit-And-Run

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — An SUV owned by a former Minnesota Vikings player has been linked to a hit-and-run that killed a pedestrian. Police say they haven't determined who was driving.

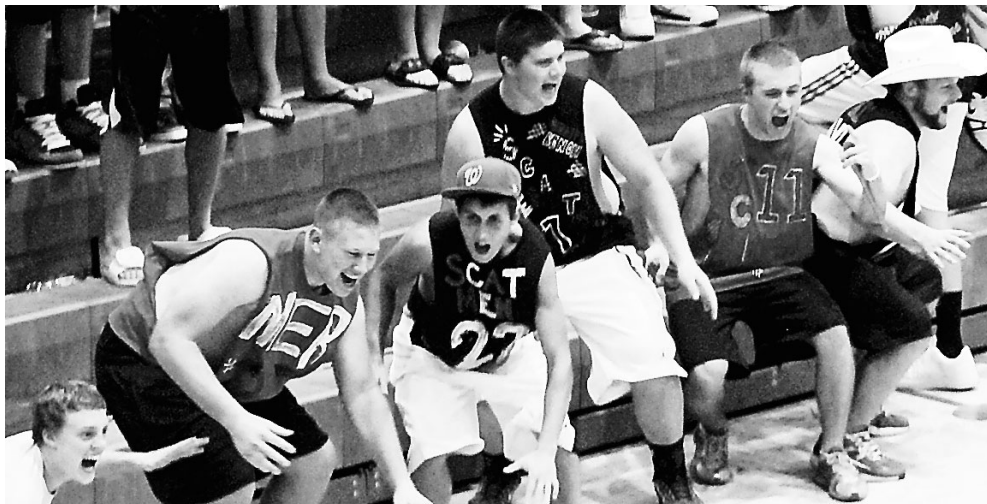
Joe Senser's attorney confirms Senser owns the Mercedes SUV investigators think was involved in an Aug. 23 crash in Minneapolis that killed 38-year-old Anousone Phanthavong (ah-NOO'-sahn PAN'-tah-wong) of Roseville, Minn.

State Patrol Lt. Eric Roeske says the patrol met this week with Senser and a family member, but they declined to answer questions about the crash. Roeske says no one has been arrested or ruled out as a suspect.

Officials say Phanthavong ran out of gas and was hit while walking an exit ramp.

Senser was a tight end for the Vikings in the 1980s. He owns Joe Senser's Restaurant and Sports Theater.

yards against the Bobcats. Deion Faulks, a senior, was Huron's work-horse with 58 yards on 14 carries while senior wideout Zach Cranston reeled off a 34-yard run. "I think they'll mix it up on us pretty good with the pass and the run," said Likness. "The key for us is not to let them stay on the field; we can't allow them to get a long drive against us and put points on the board."  
Derek Zwanziger, a 6-0, 225-pound linebacker, leads the Tiger defense. "They'll line up in a four-front or a five-front with a lot of two-deep coverage," said Likness. "That will present some problems, but hopefully we'll be able to recognize it and adjust to it."  
The Bucks were able to adjust to Pierre's coverages and threw for 128 yards on 14 passes, but Likness would have thrown more if not for the 37-8 halftime lead and 180 rushing yards on 11 carries from senior running back Connor Fitzsimmons.  
"I thought we'd throw a lot more than we did, but we ran the ball pretty well," said Likness. "We threw to set up the run."  
Defensively, the Bucks were able to control the line of scrimmage and play the majority of the game in the Governors' backfield. "That was a key for comfort," said Likness of the Bucks' effort up front.  
Austin Wagner of Pierre was able to reel off a 65-yard scoring run against the Bucks in the first

quarter while the Governors' other two scores came late and against younger Bucks.  
"We had four guys make mistakes all on one play and it showed up," said Likness of Wagner's scoring run.  
The Bucks held Wagner to just 10 yards on his other 10 carries. As week two begins, the expectations heat up.  
"You get to that gray area where you need to execute better and you need to work a little harder," said Likness. "The focus needs to stay a little crisper."  
Coming off a lopsided win and playing at Crane on Parents' Night may leave the Bucks ripe for an

upset, but Likness believes the 2011 Yankton team knows what each Friday night means.  
"It's nice to play at home because you're playing for all the past teams, you're playing for the community and you're playing for the teams that you've beaten here," said Likness. "I think this year's players understand Buck tradition as much as any team I've had."  
Likness is hoping that understanding combines with focus and execution for a win.  
"We'll find out when we play Huron tonight," said Likness. "If we're true Bucks, we'll be ready to play football."

eted and Brookings gained confidence in their play and was poised to come back and possibly win the second set. Yankton Head Coach Leasa Woodward calmly stood up and called for a timeout.  
"I told the girls that they needed to break the serve. Amelia Miller was on a roll and we just had to break her serve to get back in control," Woodward said. "We were able to do that. It was huge to score that first point after the Brookings rally."  
After breaking Miller's serve Yankton went on a 7-0 rally to close out the second set 25-15.  
In the second set, junior Kelsey Fitzgerald established herself as a serious hitting threat and senior Sarah Ekeren, who ended with five kills on the night, also came up big with some crucial kills. The establishment of hitters besides Hora was huge for the Gazelles.  
"It's very important that we have other hitters than Mikala," Woodward said. "We work on that a lot in practice and Kelsey played well tonight. Sarah Ekeren also played very well. She did everything that we needed her to do and that was a big part of our success tonight."  
The third set began with another quick start for the Gazelles

as they opened it up 4-1. Yankton had some more big scoring rallies, but this set seemed to be the set in which the Gazelles played best overall. Very few unforced errors were committed by the Gazelles, and most of the points scored by Brookings were very hard kills by their main hitters Mack Rief, Alyssa Tvedt and Amelia Miller. The set ended in with a 25-18 Yankton win.  
"We played with a lot of energy tonight," Woodward said. "Brookings is a good team and it never felt like we were more than one or two points ahead the whole match. They made us earn everything."  
The Gazelles ended the game with 33 kills. Hora led the team with 14 kills and Fitzgerald had eight kills. Assisting on 31 of those kills was setter Emily Fedders.  
"Emily has made tremendous improvements this year," Woodward said. "She places the ball great in the hitter's hands."  
The Gazelles also were assisted by the setting of outside hitter Tory Gross. Yankton runs a 5-1 offense in which they have only one setter that plays for them. When their setter is in the back row and can't position herself to set, another player has to take over these duties. Gross is the player that usually takes this task over.  
"Tory does a great job when we are out of system," Woodward said. "She does a great job setting it to the outsides when she is put in that position."  
The defense for the Gazelles

was also very strong, led by senior Chloe Cornemann who had 11 digs. "Chloe and Mikala are a couple of the fastest players in the back row," Woodward said. "They are always in relentless pursuit of the ball. We feel we can make a good play as long as a defender can get a hand on a ball."
