horse show season that CVA would sponsor a saddle to be given away for the contest. "We wanted to support the Harm & Tulleys Event Center and the events that are held there," he said.

Horse show organizers then began planning a competition that would give contestants points for entering classes at each of the four horse shows. Additional points would be earned when contestants placed in core classes, such as showmanship, horsemanship, reining, barrels and poles.

"This was the first year we offered the four series together," Greckel said. "We have several

horse shows that we have in Bloomfield at the Harm & Tulleys Event Center, but this is the first time that we made it where you would collect points for all four shows."

She said she was happy with the turnout and considered this season a success. "We were really honored to be able to host these horse shows," she said. "There were a lot of people that attended from the three-state area, and we were pretty excited about that."

There are also plans to hold a similar series next year, Greckel said.

"We plan on doing it again, but we will probably change things up a little bit," she said. "Instead of giving the total package to one winner, we'll probably spread it out so that we have a chance to give the prizes away to more people."
