- An allotment of \$18,606,767 to projects in 48 states, New York city and the District of Columbia was announced today by the National Youth Administration. The total included money for increasing student aid quotas in drought-stricken states. South Dakota received \$50,715 for the drought and \$218,175 in other aid.
- With an enrollment of 114 students coming from Idaho, Missouri, Minnesota, Iowa, Nebraska, North Dakota and South Dakota, class work has started at the new Mount Marty college and high school in Yankton.

### L&M Radiator Completes Expansion

L&M Radiator, Inc., has completed the expansion of the plant it leases from Yankton Area Progressive Growth and is planning an open house for the public Saturday, Sept. 17.

The expansion doubles the manufacturing space from 40,000 to 80,000 square feet and includes an investment of \$1.5 million by L&M in new equipment and a state of the art painting facility.

The addition makes Yankton the company's largest manufacturing facility, according to Dan Chisholm, company president.

"We are very pleased with our decision to locate a plant in Yankton four years ago," Chisholm said. "The State of South Dakota and the City of Yankton have been very cooperative in helping us locate and expand here, and the work force has quickly learned our manufacturing processes and is highly motivated."

The open house for the public to visit the facility will take place from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Refreshments will be provided.

Chisholm said L&M currently employs 89 at the Yankton plant. The expansion has created an immediate need for several new employees with a demand for more expected by the end of the year. Open positions are in the manufacturing and assembly area, and two in the warehouse.

Chisholm said people interested in applying for the positions could do so online at www.mesabi.com, or they can apply in person at a plant open house scheduled for Sept. 17.

Supervisors will be available to answer questions related to employment opportunities.
