**S.D. Guard Flood Response Efforts Come To An End**

**RAPID CITY** — For the past three months, the South Dakota National Guard has worked alongside local, state and federal agencies, as well as volunteers and impacted residents, to battle this summer's historic Missouri River flooding.

On May 27, the first Soldiers arrived in the communities of Pierre and Fort Pierre to begin filling sandbags. And on Sept. 2, the last Airmen stepped off the levees at Dakota Dunes. The Guard officially ended its response efforts that day in one of the most significant floods to hit the state.

With the exception of the 1972 Rapid City Flood, at no other time in its history has the SDNG activated in such numbers and duration for a state emergency. Approximately 2,000 soldiers and airmen served on state active-duty orders during the course of flood operations. At the height of flood operations, nearly 1,300 SDNG men and women were on orders at a single time.

"Our Guard members performed brilliantly during the historic Missouri River flood of 2011," said Maj. Gen. Tim Reisch, adjutant general for the SDNG. "I believe what we accomplished demonstrates the true quality of our organization. Despite

having little notice and more than 300 soldiers deployed overseas, it speaks volumes about the caliber of Soldiers and airmen serving in the South Dakota National Guard."

While Guardsmen served varying lengths of time during the 99-day operation, a total of 41,721 work days have been attributed to response efforts, which included coordination with state agencies, filling and emplacing sandbags, building levees, conducting levee patrol and repair, and providing area security, to name a few.

While the Guard's flood operations have concluded and the flood waters receded, the impact left behind by the Guard will be felt long afterward.

Overall cost estimates for SDNG involvement totaled more than \$8 million, with more than \$6 million associated with personnel payroll and \$2 million associated with logistical support.

At the height of operations, sandbagging crews at more than 20 sites were producing nearly 500,000 sandbags per day.

To help keep the Missouri at bay, the SDNG assisted with the construction of levees with scrapers, loaders dump trucks and

bulldozers. These efforts helped to contain the record three month water releases (ranging predominantly from 150,000 cubic feet per second up to 165,000 cfs) at various dams along the river.

Guard members conducted foot patrols on 12-hour shifts, 24-hours a day, to monitor the levee systems for problematic areas. Quick reactionary forces were on hand to respond to integrity issues with the levees or critical infrastructure in a timely fashion.
