Hartington Vineyard Gets Grant For Events Center

HARTINGTON, Neb. — A Hartington vineyard has received \$192,500 to build an events/conference center.
 Nissen Wine, Inc., has been awarded the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) to build the center. The Nebraska Department of Economic Development (DED) awarded the grant Monday.
 The Nissens are building and operating the events/conference center. Cedar County was used as the local government entity for awarding the grant, according to County Clerk Dave Dowling.
 The project will create five full-time positions, according to a press release.
 The vineyard is located along the Outlaw and Shannon trails in the hills north of Hartington. The vineyard and trails are considered

key area tourist attractions, and the CDBG funding came for projects in the tourism development category.
 Hartington Community Development Corporation also is helping finance the project's total \$290,500 costs, the release said.
 The Northeast Nebraska Economic Development District (NENEDD) office in Norfolk, Neb., also worked with the project, Dowling said.
 Federal funds are made available to DED from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's CDBG program to assist with the development of businesses and communities throughout the state.
 Funding requests for this program are administered by DED and are available to local governments with populations less than 50,000 and counties in Nebraska.
