CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly fell Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery dropped 25.25 cents to \$7.02 a bushel; December corn fell 22.50 cents to \$7.23 a bushel; December oats fell 1 cent to \$3.44 a bushel; while November soybeans fell 4.25 cents to \$13.9175 a bushel. ### FEMA Teams Available This Weekend To Give Advice On Cleanup

Repairing or cleaning up a home after a disaster can be a daunting task. But with the right information, homeowners can clean up safely and build back smarter and stronger. Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) mitigation teams will be on hand this weekend at Kopetsky's Ace Hardware in Yankton to provide free advice about how best to clean up mold, mildew and bacteria, and cost-effective ways to rebuild to reduce the risk of damages from future disasters. Free publications on these topics will also be available. The teams will be at Kopetsky's Ace Hardware 2404 Broadway Avenue on Friday, Sept. 16, from noon-5 p.m. Online help is also available at the following websites to find out about:

status of their claims and validating information, in case something is incorrectly entered into the system," Colton said. "If they are then referred to the SBA in that registration process, they can certainly come in and talk with the SBA people who are here to get their questions answered. If they haven't received an application, they can certainly get one here and get assistance in filling it out." SBA assists in a disaster with the intent of getting people back into the position they were prior to the disaster. "We will lend up to \$200,000 to help a homeowner rebuild," Colton said. "After we receive a homeowner application, we actually send one of our inspectors out on site to evaluate the damage. They do a building estimate on what it will cost to clean up the damage and how much will it take in labor and materials to replace what was damaged on the building. That is what determines how much of that \$200,000 will be eligible to a person. "On top of that, homeowners and renters are eligible for up to \$40,000 to replace personal property. Renters obviously don't own the property so they don't need it for that piece. They are eligible for that personal aspect: clothing, furniture, even a personal automobile." While the SBA loans only cover uncompensated loss because insurance can be slow to respond, the SBA loans offer those affected a chance to start recovery sooner rather than later. "If people do have insurance, we can work with them on insurance settlements at a later time," Colton said. "In fact if they have started rebuilding and they have used the SBA loan, we can apply their insurance settlement to reduce the amount of the loan and reamortize the loan so people can get out of debt to us that much quicker." With an SBA loan, the government is the lender, so people do not have to go through banks. The loans are at a fixed rate for the life of the loan, with a time duration of up to 30 years with interest rates typically at 2.563 percent for homeowners and renters; for businesses, it's between 4-6 percent. "Every person is looked at individually and based on the ability to repay it," Colton said. "We don't want people in debt forever." Colton said the best advice he can give homeowners affected by the flood is to fill out the application immediately, because otherwise it can slow down all assistance. "The way it works is FEMA takes an application and makes them eligible for emergency assistance to get them safe and secure," he said. "If (homeowners) qualify at that point and time, they will notify us and we will send them an application for a loan." Colton explained that at that point, the FEMA programs kind of get put on hold, waiting for completion of the SBA application. Saying that even if a person thinks
