Avon Elementary School Receives National Blue Ribbon Award

AVON — The Avon elementary school has been named one of three South Dakota schools receiving the Blue Ribbon Award from the U.S. Department of Education.

The other South Dakota schools are Hamlin Junior High in Hayti and Sharon F. Delzer Elementary in Estelline.

The schools are three of more than 300 winners nationwide, which honors high levels of achievement in both public and private K-12 schools.

To be eligible for recognition for the Blue Ribbon Award, schools must meet one of two criteria. They must show excellent student performance regardless of the school's demographics, or they must show improved student performance to high levels and reduced the achievement gap among disadvantaged students.

The principal and one teacher from each school will be invited

to represent their facility at the Nov. 14-15 awards ceremony in Washington, D.C. At that time, they will receive a Blue Ribbon Schools plaque and flag.

Established in 1982, The Blue Ribbon Schools Program is part of a larger effort from the Department of Education to both identify and broadcast outstanding leadership and teaching practices throughout the nation.

U.S. Sen. Tim Johnson (D-S.D.) commended the South Dakota winners for the award.

"Receiving a National Blue Ribbon Award from the Department of Education is a major honor for these schools and their students and staff," the senator said.

"By meeting this high standard of education across the K-12 spectrum, these students are more capable and better prepared for both jobs and higher education. I congratulate these schools for their significant progress and achievement in the classroom."

"When we got there, (Mel's Body Shop) was pretty well downed," he said. "The two-story wood structure to the north of it had a fire in the attic and the second floor. What made it so difficult to get at from the ground was, the brick (body shop) was only about three feet away. You couldn't get between them, and the brick wall wasn't stable."

The ladder truck was used to attack the fire from above. However, plaster and false ceilings still made it difficult for firefighters to get at the blaze, Nickles said. With the fire and so much water sprayed into the top of the home, officials didn't want to risk physically sending firefighters up to the second floor to try to get at the flames from below, he explained.

"We shut all the water lines down and let the fire go for a while so it would show itself by burning some of the roof out of

the way," Nickles said. "Then we could get at it. When you don't want to put anybody up in the building, that's kind of what you have to do. It worked."

Nickles said Yankton firefighters were on scene until 1:06 a.m. "We were glad to be able to help out to get the fire stopped," he stated.

Wagner said the fire was mostly out by 1:30 a.m. However, many members of the Tyndall Fire Department were on scene until 4 a.m., during which the fire flared up several times. After that, three firefighters remained until morning and someone has been on site throughout the day.

The brick walls of the body shop were expected to be knocked down Thursday because they were considered a safety hazard, Wagner said.

The state fire marshal, the state Division of Criminal Investigation and the federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives investigated the scene but had not determined a cause of the blaze, according to Wagner. The investigation continues.

He said neither structure was insured and both are total losses.
