Funding To Advance Community Health Center Plans in Yankton Announced

Lewis & Clark Behavioral Health Services, Inc. in Yankton will receive an \$80,000 federal planning grant to study the feasibility of a community health center (CHC).

The funding, made available through the Affordable Care Act, will bring the Yankton area one step closer to meeting the needs of underserved citizens.

U.S. Sen. Tim Johnson (D-S.D.) announced the grant Friday.

"One of the reasons I supported health care reform is the investments it made in community health centers," he said. "Community health centers ensure that care will be available to folks when they need it most."

Johnson has supported efforts to establish a community health center in Yankton and met with area health care leaders to discuss the plan earlier this year.

In 2010, the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) granted the State of South Dakota's request to classify Yankton County as a Medically Underserved Population, the first step in establishing the center. Johnson wrote directly to HRSA in support of this project.

Health care reform invested substantially in funding for community health centers to meet the increased demand for services, according to the press release. In addition to increasing levels in regular appropriations, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act established a Community Health Center Fund.

The legislation appropriates a total of \$11 billion to the fund over the five-year period of fiscal year 2011 through fiscal year 2015, the press release said.

Community health centers play an important role in South Dakota, providing care at 37 service sites, according to the release. More than 59,000 patients used CHCs in 2009, 65 percent of whom earned under 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level.
