Hutchinson Co. Shooting Suspects Being Sought

PIERRE — Law enforcement is seeking three suspects in a July incident in rural Hutchinson County in which multiple shots were allegedly fired near a Hutterite colony.

According to a press release from the South Dakota Attorney General's Office, officials are looking for three Caucasian males, ages 15-25, who were believed to be involved in the incident, which occurred near Old Elm Colony in the early hours of July 31. According to the press release, "These individuals are wanted for questioning regarding an incident that involved multiple rounds being discharged from a rifle." No other information on the incident was provided.

The three were believed to be driving a late-model white Ford F250 crew cab pickup.

The incident is being investigated by the Hutchinson County Sheriff's Office and the Division of Criminal Investigation.
