It's hard to believe that, not that long ago, college football used to be about tradition. Next week, the University of Nebraska plays its first football game in the Big Ten (plus-2) Conference, after departing the Big 12 (now minus-2 and counting). Before that happens, you could see dozens of colleges leave their current home for supposed greener pastures. Pitt and Syracuse have already made their jump, leaving the basketball mecca known as the Big East for the Atlantic Coast Conference, a great basketball league in its own right, but with supposedly better football. The Big East is now considering a merger with what is left of the Big 12 after the Oklahoma schools,

Texas and Texas A&M (maybe more) depart. Missouri flirted with the Big Ten last year, but now has its eyes on the SEC. The Mountain West and Conference USA are talking about a football-only merger, one that would make the league a 22-team goliath that stretches from coast to coast. All of this is posturing to try to improve the school's chances at a Bowl Championship Series berth — and the big payday that comes with it. But where will it end? If you ask most college football fans, they would tell you exactly where it should end — with an actual, decide-the-tile-on-the-field playoff system. Unfortunately, big bowl money won't let that happen. So when does the NCAA put its foot down and take control?

TIGERS CLAIM BIG 8 GOLF

LENNOX — The Harrisburg Tigers put three golfers at 80 or under to claim the team crown at the Big 8 Conference Boys' Golf Tournament on Monday at Lenkota Country Club in Lennox. Harrisburg shot a 322 to out-distance West Central by 27 strokes. Vermillion was third at 364. Nick Skajewski of Harrisburg was the overall champion at 77, two strokes ahead of teammate Cade McLaughlin and Dusty Javers of Lennox.
