GRAND FORKS, N.D. (AP) — The University of North Dakota basketball team has hired former NBA point guard Dean Oliver as an assistant coach. Oliver recently retired from professional basketball after a nine-year career that included two seasons with the Golden State Warriors in the early 2000s. The Mason City, Iowa, native and former University of Iowa standout played for a team in a French league last season. UND head coach Brian Jones was an assistant at Iowa during Oliver's final two years there.

Nebraska-Omaha Men's Basketball To Play In New Ralston Arena

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — The Nebraska-Omaha men's basketball team will move off campus and into a brand-new arena for the 2012-2013 season. Athletic Director Trev Alberts announced the move on Tuesday. He says the Mavericks will play in the new 4,000-seat Ralston arena that is expected to be completed next fall. Alberts says the Ralston arena will provide first-class amenities for athletes and fans, and it will be located just south of campus. The Nebraska-Omaha men have played in Sapp Fieldhouse on campus since that building opened in 1949. They will continue to play there this season. Coach Darrin Hansen says the new arena will be a good recruiting tool for Nebraska-Omaha as it moves up to Division I.
