LaVern Benedict Mazourek, son of Emil and Rose (Kocmick) Mazourek, was born on a farm south of Dante, SD on January 24, 1918. He died Thursday, September 22, 2011 at the Community Memorial Hospital in Wagner. LaVern attained the age of 93 years, seven months and 30 days.

LaVern attended country school through the eighth grade and one year at Wagner High School. He worked on a dairy farm in Lakefield, MN from 1939 to 1941. LaVern returned home and then volunteered for the U.S. Army in 1941 beginning with training in Troop A 4th Cavalry at Fort Meade, SD. He served in five battles during World War II: Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland, Ardennes and Central Europe. LaVern earned five battle stars and a distinguished unit badge. He served for 4 1/2 years and was honorably discharged in October of 1945.

LaVern returned to the

City To Consider Utility Rate Increases

The Yankton City Commission will consider three utility rate increases Monday night.

A 3 percent hike in rates for solid waste collection, water and sewer will take effect Nov. 1 if approved by the commission.

In other business, commissioners will resume discussion of a proposed daycare ordinance that was last talked about in December. The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.

Spillway To Be Closed For Maintenance

The road that crosses Gavins Point Dam, also known as Crest Road or the spillway, will be closed from 8: a.m. Monday, Sept. 26, through 5 p.m. Friday, Sept. 30, to conduct maintenance at the powerplant. Note that this will include overnight hours.

Menno Awarded Loan For Water Meter

PIERRE — Menno has received a loan from the state Board of Water and Natural Resources, the office of Gov. Dennis Daugaard has announced.

The \$157,000 loan will be used for water meter replacement, with \$39,250 awarded as principal forgiveness.

A total of \$3.2 million was awarded to various environmental projects by the board, which met Thursday.

"Making grant and loan funds available for these projects will result in better drinking water and enhanced protection of the environment," the governor said in a press release.

The grants and loans awarded by the board are administered through the South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

Sandbag Cleanup Day Event Slated Today

The Yankton Area Chamber of Commerce, Keep Yankton Beautiful, Missouri River Futures and the National Park Service is looking for volunteers to help with the cleanup process at the affected areas of the Missouri River today (Saturday), beginning at 9 a.m.

Areas that will need assistance on Saturday include: 1103 Sister Grove, 212 Kay Street, 217 Kay Street, 2603 Moonlight Drive, Larson's Landing and Lexie Lane.

Anyone willing to help is asked to meet at the Riverside Acres Park staging area for assignments. Trucks, trailers and skid loaders will be needed at several of the properties to haul sandbags to a nearby collection site. Property owners have the option of using the sand or taking the bags to the collection site set up by the county.

Property owners keeping the sand are responsible for the proper disposal of the empty bags. Owners keeping the sand for use will need help opening bags and spreading it around their property. Volunteers are asked to bring a knife to cut bags and to wear gloves and proper shoes.

If you are not available today but would like to help out during the week, help is needed at 100 Kay Street after 4 p.m. to cut bags and spread out sand. Contact Carol at (605) 665-4855 for directions and to schedule times.
