Graham's attorney, John Murphy, suggested that Looking Cloud had embellished his story to get his life sentence reduced. Looking Cloud agreed that he had left out details before, but repeatedly said he was trying to tell the truth in the testimony. Aquash's elder daughter, Denise Maloney Pictou, said Monday that she had no comment on the sentence reduction. AIM was founded in the late 1960s to protest the U.S. government's treatment of Indians and demand the government honor its treaties with Indian tribes. The group grabbed headlines in 1973 when it took over the village of Wounded Knee, leading to a 71-day standoff with federal agents that included the exchange of gunfire. Prosecutors believe Graham, Looking Cloud and a third AIM activist kidnapped and killed Aquash because AIM leaders thought she was a government spy.
