son was assaulted and his uniform taken, Robert carted a large box toward the prison gate with Berget inside. Both inmates were apprehended before leaving the grounds.

The penitentiary made more than a dozen procedural changes less than a month after Johnson's killing, including adding officers to three areas of the prison and installing additional security cameras. Other changes outlined in a 28-page report released by the state in May included further restricting inmate traffic, strengthening perimeter fencing, improving lighting and mandating body alarm "panic buttons" for staff.

The report determined prison staff followed all policies and procedures during the incident, and Berget and Robert were assigned appropriately to their work positions. Neither inmate had a history of violence behind bars, Warden Doug Weber previously told The Associated Press.

Roger admits that some people — including the Pietzes themselves — questioned starting up a new business as a recession kicked in.

"We were very uncertain of this, but we continued because we put so much time and effort into it," he said. "Even with these tough economic times, we have found the local people really support us because the product has that home-made quality. We also do tremendous amounts of promotion."

The Pietzes started selling kuchen in Scotland and Tyndall grocery stores, then area supermarkets. Now in its fourth year, the business offers 15 varieties of kuchen and has added kolaches, a Czech pastry.

The kuchen and kolaches are sold at nearly 60 retail shops around South Dakota as well as areas in Minnesota and Iowa. The Pietzes currently employ four people.

The success has even spawned the annual Kuchen Festival and the crowning of a Kuchen Queen to represent the community. The queen's

Part of the confidence in taking more was the support of the Yankton community the organization received after bringing in the last group, Humpal explained. Donations were given for food and health-care costs, and the dogs were adopted in a short period of time.
