MATCHUPS

COYOTE OFFENSE VS. UM DEFENSE
USD will have four new starters on the line and a new quarterback in Josh Vander Maten. Montana's linebacking corp could give the Coyotes some problems. Slight edge here to the Grizzlies.

COYOTE DEFENSE VS. UM OFFENSE
Like the Coyotes, the Grizzlies will have a new QB but will rely on a stable of quality backs. Tight end Greg Hardy will present a challenge for the Coyotes' 3-4 defense, even with Tyler Starr roaming around the edge. We'll give the nod here to USD and its veteran secondary.

SPECIAL TEAMS
Montana replaces kicker and punter Brody McKnight, while USD returns fourth punter Cole Zwiefelhofer (43.1-yard average). Significant edge to USD.

INTANGIBLES
Where to start? Montana is looking to move on from off-season legal issues and USD is looking to start the Joe Glenn era off on the right foot. The Grizzlies, in their home stadium, have the obvious advantage.

Quick Hitters

■ SDSU broke from tradition by naming two non-seniors — junior DB Winston Wright and sophomore QB Austin Sumner — as team captains. The other three captains are TE Seth Daughters, DB Bo Helm and LB Ross Shafrath.

■ Sumner, the 2011 Missouri Valley Football Conference Freshman of the Year, is not expected to play due to injury. Red-shirt freshman Eric Kline will get the start under center for the Jacks.

■ Tyrel Kool, a senior from Yankton, will see time both as a receiver and a running back this fall. As a starting receiver in 2010, he led the Jacks with 64 catches (808 yards, 2 TD). He led SDSU in rushing last season with 534 yards and four scores, and added 26 more catches to his career total.

■ Kansas senior D.J. Beshears led the Big 12 in kick return yards (1,014) a year ago, and had 285 all-purpose yards in the Jayhawks' victory over Northern Illinois.

■ Charlie Weis is in his second collegiate head coaching job, after coaching Notre Dame from 2005-09. He coached in

the NFL from 1990-2004, then again in 2010. He served as offensive coordinator at the University of Florida last season.

Key Matchup

Kansas run game vs. SDSU defensive front. The Jayhawks return two backups — James Sims (727 yards, 9 TD) and Tony Pierson (396 yards, 3 TD) — who combined to tally over 1,100 yards on the ground a year ago. With a young QB and a new coach, Kansas will expect those two to carry the load against an SDSU defense that allowed 4.8 yards per carry last season. The Jackrabbits will have to do better to avoid getting blown over by the Jayhawks.

From The Coach

■ "We'll have to coach our tails off come the end of the first quarter when we see what they run offensively and defensively," SDSU head coach John Stiegelmeier, on facing Kansas, which opens the Charlie Weis era against SDSU.

Quick Hitters

■ Senior I-back Rex Burkhead (1,357 yards, 17 TD) is on several watch lists entering his final season, including the Doak Walker and Walter Camp award watch lists. He and quarterback Taylor Martinez rank as the top returning QB-RB rushing combo in the FBS this season, having combined for 2,231 yards a year ago.

■ Nebraska placed five walk-ons on scholarship prior to this season, including Ponca, Neb., native Justin Blatchford, a senior safety. Seniors kicker Brett Maher, guard Seung Hoon Choi, center Justin Jackson and junior guard Spencer Long were the others.

■ The Southern Miss offense must replace its quarterback, top rusher and two receivers from a year ago, but the Golden Eagles return their top four tacklers.

■ Ellis Johnson will make his debut as the head coach for Southern Miss in this contest. He comes in with a 17-28 career record. He was the defensive coordinator of the South Carolina team that beat Nebraska 30-13 in the 2012 Capital One Bowl.

Key Matchup

Nebraska defense vs. Southern Miss offense: Nebraska's experienced front will try

to contain a Golden Eagles offense that had to replace several key components from a year ago. If Southern Miss can escape that front line rush, it may be able to exploit less experienced linebackers and defensive backs for the Cornhuskers.

■ "Yeah, Rex wants to play every snap. It's up to us to manage that. At the same time, we need to get the ball in his hands and get some carries." Nebraska head coach Bo Pelini on managing Burkhead's workload this week.

Vander Maten, a former walk-on who had eyes on playing basketball at USD, appeared in seven games as a redshirt freshman last season. He completed 22-of-38 passes for

221 yards and three touchdowns, also ran in for a score.

A mobile quarterback who can extend the defense laterally, Vander Maten will line up behind a

starting line that includes senior Tim Ross, juniors Cody O'Neill and Marc Murtha, and sophomore Andrew Schofield.

"I've tried to help the offense

move along, and it's been fun to see the young guys get it done," Powell, the team's No. 1 receiver, said. "We lost a lot of starters, most on the offensive line. But

hopefully everyone can gel and we can get through it with a win."
