



YSD Announces Early Dismissal For Homecoming Parade

All Yankton Public School students-including Jr. Kindergarten, Kindergarten and Special Education Preschool classes will be dismissed at 2:15 p.m. p.m. on Friday, Sept. 14, for the Yankton High School Pioneer Days Homecoming Parade. Parents of Preschool students at Webster should pick them up at school at 2:15 p.m. The parade will begin at 2:30 p.m.

All school buses will be running on their regular schedules for students who need a ride home.

With the exception of Webster School Preschool students, all rural elementary

students who ride Yankton School District buses, will be escorted to the parade route and transported home at the regular time. Parents of elementary students may pick up their bus students at school at 2:15 p.m. by notifying the principal.

The parade starts at Eighth and Douglas and proceeds south to Sixth Street, west on Sixth Street to Cedar Street, south on Cedar Street to Third Street, east on Third Street to Pine Street, and north on Pine Street to Eighth Street.

If inclement weather occurs, the parade will be cancelled and school will be in session.

In November, Powell had asked if the county would release the remaining \$76,000 of the bond for the project. However, commissioners decided to hold on to it because they felt it was the only bargaining chip they had with LRC to make sure the repairs were made to the trail.

"Thank God we did not release the bond," Commissioner Garry Moore said Wednesday. "They still haven't stepped forward to have the bond released, so apparently they don't want it released."

The commission voted unanimously to authorize the state's attorney to request a forfeiture of the bond for LRC on the bike trail project. Furthermore, they asked that LRC be notified by registered letter that it is not to proceed with any work on the trail after 3:30 p.m. Sept. 5.

Jensen said a new contractor will have to be found, and work will almost certainly not proceed until next year. The bond
