Behavioral Health Recovery Can Be Achieved

LINCOLN, Neb. — Addiction treatment and mental health services can help those with mental and/or substance use disorders live healthy and rewarding lives, according to the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services.
"People with mental illnesses or substance use disorders can manage and recover from those conditions, just like people manage and recover from other health conditions, like hypertension, diabetes, asthma, and heart disease," said Scot L. Adams, director of the Division of Behavioral Health. "Many individuals are living happy and healthy lives in long-term recovery, with stronger relationships and a sense of self-worth."
In Nebraska, more than 36,800 people received services through the state's public behavioral health system in 2011. Treatment included psychotherapy, medications, and peer support. Peer support is offered by people who are in recovery to help others achieve their own recoveries.
"There are millions of Americans whose lives have been transformed through recovery," Adams said. "People in recovery achieve healthy lifestyles, both physically and emotionally, and contribute in positive ways to their communities."
"While the road to recovery may be difficult, the benefits of overcoming behavioral health conditions are significant and valuable to individuals, families, and communities," Adams said.
"Too many people are still unaware that prevention works, treatment is effective, and people recover. Help is available," he said.

Grants Available To 4-H Clubs And FFA/FCCLA

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Agriculture announces that grant funding is now available through the Building Our South Dakota Rural Communities (BOSDR) grant program.
Grants are open to 4-H clubs, FFA chapters, and Family Career and Community Leaders (FCCLA) of America chapters. The grants were developed to demonstrate the importance of rural communities and the value of organizations that work together to improve rural life.
Two types of grants are available. The basic grant is used for community improvement projects and is limited to \$750 per project. The safety grant is used for projects that enhance public safety and is limited to \$200 per project.
Any 4-H club, FFA or FCCLA chapter in South Dakota can apply for the BOSDR grant. Applications are due by Wednesday, Oct. 31, 2012. Grant awardees will be announced at the end of November.

Hay To Be Removed From Hwy. Right Of Way

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Transportation requests the cooperation of all farmers and ranchers in removing processed hay from the highway right of way.
State regulations require that hay be removed from the right of way within 30 days of being processed, but no later than Oct. 1.
Removing hay bales from the highway right of way is an important safety consideration for motorists. The bales or stacks can be a safety hazard for vehicles forced to leave the road and, in some cases, can restrict a driver's sight distance. Hay left in the road ditches late in the year can also cause snowdrifts across the highway.
