Police Warn Of Camper Battery Thefts Occuring In Yankton

The Yankton Police Department is asking residents to take precautions in light of a handful of camper battery thefts.

According to Lt. Todd Brandt, there have been four such thefts since the end of August.

"The crimes have been concentrated in the northeast part of Yankton," he said. "We're strongly encouraging people to be watchful of suspicious people in the area and to report anything unusual. Check your camper out to make sure your battery is secured. If you can't secure it, it

would be best to remove it and put it in a locked garage."

The thefts have been reported in the 2200 block of Mulberry Street, the 1800 block of Peninah Street, 2100 block of Valley Road and the 300 block of East 23rd Street. The latest incident was reported Friday afternoon. Brandt said he is not aware of

a specific reason the batteries would be a target of thieves. The police department can be reached at (605) 668-5210.
