PIERRE — On Sept. 25, South Dakota Housing for the Homeless Consortium (SDHHC), an affiliate of South Dakota Housing Development Authority, will conduct its annual statewide homeless count.

We are asking for volunteers to join others who are committed to ending homelessness to assist in conducting the count," said Lisa Bondy, state coordinator for SDHHC.

Volunteers are trained, teamed up, and given the supplies and information necessary to conduct the count in their neighborhoods, communities, or counties. The count is conducted by interacting with both service agencies and homeless individuals. With the help of volunteers, SDHHC will continue to focus on reaching the more rural areas of the state.

"We are asking for volunteers all over the state to help conduct this survey. Our goal is to be in contact with homeless individuals or families and see in what ways we can help," said Bondy.

The statewide survey is broken down into three geographical areas according to counties - West River, East River and Central South Dakota. • Of those surveyed, 15 percent were single parent families, 75 percent were individuals, 3 percent married couples with no children and 6 percent married couples with children.
