5-0, 5-0 in the ESD. Twelve months ago, Yankton was in exactly the same spot they are now. Then came a line of Sioux Falls metro teams and four losses in six games: 41-0 to Roosevelt, 29-14 at Washington, 49-7 to Brandon Valley, 54-14 to O'Gorman. Those first three teams still loom on Yankton's regular season schedule, beginning with defending state champion Roosevelt at Howard Wood Field in six days.

Yes, Yankton has, for the most part, looked good in its first five victories. Several other teams, though, have looked good against those teams as well.

Yankton's Been Here Before. What Happens Next? For decades, Yankton and Sioux Falls O'Gorman dominated the Sioux Falls programs like the Sioux Falls programs now dominate the rest of the state. Washington's 1987 loss to Rapid City Stevens was the only Sioux Falls public school title game appearance from the start of the playoff era, 1981, until 2004. In 2006, Roosevelt finally broke the Sioux Falls blockade on the title, and the state's largest city has held the stranglehold on Class

11AA ever since. This season, though, will be judged by what happens in the second half and post-season. Yankton's recent history against the Sioux Falls area programs matters just as much as Yankton's history of dominance over those same teams prior to 2007: exactly zero. What will matter is which team works the hardest and executes

the best on the field on that day. So will this year's Bucks make the most of their 5-0 start? We'll find out beginning next week.
