VERMILLION — The University of South Dakota will have another Williams in its basketball family.

Lloyd Williams, wife of new USD women's basketball coach Amy Williams, announced via Twitter on Monday that he was named an assistant with the Coyote men's program. No official announcement has been made by USD.

Lloyd Williams resigned in July after spending one season as coach at Muskogee (Okla.) High School. Prior to that, he spent two seasons as head men's coach at Rogers State University, an NAIA school in Oklahoma — the same school his wife coached at before coming to USD.

Before coming to Rogers State, Lloyd Williams was an assistant at the University of Texas-San Antonio for three seasons.

Witzmann Earns MVFC Honors

ST. LOUIS — South Dakota State left tackle Bryan Witzmann has been named Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance in the Jackrabbits' Sept. 22 victory at 22nd-ranked Indiana State.

A junior from Houlton, Wis., Witzmann anchored an offensive line that paved the way for the Jackrabbits to rush for 297 yards. He received a championship grade of 1.81 as SDSU averaged 6.6 yards per carry and rolled up 348 yards of total offense en route to its third consecutive win.

Witzmann has started all 26 games during his three seasons in a South Dakota State uniform. He is the second Jackrabbit to earn the weekly offensive lineman award this season, joining senior center Will Castle following SDSU's Sept. 8 victory at Southeastern Louisiana.

The 25th-ranked Jackrabbits return home this Saturday to face Missouri State in the 46th Annual Cereal Bowl. Kickoff is slated for 6 p.m. at

Coughlin-Alumni Stadium with the game slated to be televised on Media.com.

Wagner's Kokesh Ranked Pre-Season For Husker Wrestling

LINCOLN, Neb. — Wagner native Robert Kokesh was among six University of Nebraska wrestlers to earn pre-season rankings in their weight classes by D1WC, which released its list Monday.

At 165 points, Kokesh, a sophomore, earned the No. 6 ranking. He went 30-7 as a redshirt freshman during the 2011-12 season, where he helped lead the Huskers with a 17-2 record in dual meets. He finished third at the Big Ten Championships before going 2-2 at the NCAA Championships.

Among the other Huskers to be ranked are Ridge Kiley (141 pounds), Jake Suefloh (149), James Green (157), Tyler Koehn (174) and Josh Ihnen (184).

Two Huskers Honored By Big Ten

LINCOLN, Neb. — A pair of Huskers standouts were recognized by the Big Ten Conference for their performances last Saturday. Sophomore Ameer Abdullah was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week, while Imani Cross was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

Abdullah returned an Idaho State punt 81 yards for a touchdown in Saturday's win, marking the Huskers' first punt return for a score since 2010. He accounted for 129 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns in Nebraska's 73-7 win. It is the second time that Abdullah has received the Big Ten Special Teams honor.

Cross is honored for the first time in his career following his 100-yard effort in Saturday's win, finishing with 100 yards and a score on 12 carries. He added Nebraska's final score on a 20-yard run in the fourth quarter, becoming the first Husker true freshman to crack the 100-yard mark since Rex Burkhead in 2009. He was part of a ground attack that helped the Huskers compile 385 rushing yards against Idaho State.

The Huskers return to action on Saturday night when they host the Wisconsin Badgers at 7 p.m. The game will be televised nationally on ABC and also carried on the Husker Sports Network.
