Composting Animal Losses Seminar Set

BROOKINGS — SDSU Extension provides livestock producers with a unique opportunity to learn about using composting to dispose of animal mortalities during Composting Animal Losses demonstration and seminar Oct. 1.

National expert and well-known expert on this subject, Mark Hutchinson will lead the demonstration and seminar. Hutchinson is an Extension Professor with the Maine Compost School and the University of Maine Cooperative Extension.
