Reese's poetry and prose have been widely published, most recently in *New York Quarterly*, *Poetry East*, *Paterson Literary Review*, *Louisiana Literature Review*, *Connecticut Review*, and elsewhere. His new book "ghost on 3rd" was nominated for the Pulitzer Prize in letters by *New York Quarterly Books* and was a Finalist for the 2010 Milt Kessler Poetry Award.
