CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were lower Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery fell 1 cent to \$6.4625 a bushel; December corn fell 5.75 cents to \$4.6950 a bushel; December oats were 2 cents lower at \$3.28 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 34.25 cents to \$13.5250 a bushel.

Beef was mixed and pork prices were higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

October live cattle fell .20 cent to \$1.26 a pound; October feeder cattle was .15 cent higher at \$1.5925 a pound; while October lean hogs were 1.12 cents higher at \$8.912 a pound.
