Centerville Care Center Benefit Set

CENTERVILLE — Join the Centerville community on Saturday, Sept. 14, to offer support for the Centerville Care & Rehab Center. The fundraising event at the Centerville Legion Hall includes a light supper and silent auction from 5-7 p.m. and a live auction at 7 p.m.

The Center is one of the city's largest employers. Life in the community would change if there was no nursing home in Centerville. Some 40 residents and more than 40 jobs would be gone. That loss would be felt by the pharmacy, the gas station and other businesses in the community.

"The ripple effect of losing this important business would have too great of a detrimental impact on Centerville," said Bill Hansen, Centerville Development Corp. Coordinator and chairman of the fundraising committee for Centerville Care & Rehab Center.

In addition, keeping a nursing home in the community offers essential services to families in the area who need care and/or therapy for a loved one.

Operation of the Centerville Care & Rehab Center transferred to the Centerville Development Corp. earlier this year when Good Samaritan said it would close the doors if someone didn't take over. But that changeover comes with a lot of expenses, including deferred maintenance, repairs and regular operating expenses such as utilities and salaries.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery fell 6.50 cents to \$6.4125 a bushel; December corn fell 4.75 cents to \$4.6350 a bushel; December oats were 5.75 cents lower at \$3.1375 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 11.25 cents to \$13.5650 a bushel.

Beef was mixed and pork prices were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

October live cattle fell .32 cent to \$1.2535 a pound; October feeder cattle was .03 cent higher at \$1.5805 a pound; while October lean hogs were .03 cent lower at \$.9087 a pound.

• At a meeting of the state board of charities and corrections, held in Sioux Falls yesterday, bids were opened for the furnishings for the new women's building nearing completion at the state hospital north of Yankton. The contract went to the Johnson Furnitures Co. of Mitchell. The Mitchell firm was the lowest of four bidders. The winning bid was \$5,654.77.

• Two separate collections of fossils and minerals have been donated to the Yankton College museum by the proprietors of mineral shops in the Badlands region. One outstanding specimen is a borax-type mineral sandwiched between two layers of gray chalcodony which measures about 18 inches in diameter.

• The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and a U.S. Army National Guard unit from Platte will work together to improve the habitat for two groups of birds that are recognized as endangered species. Michael Shea, lake manager of the Corps' Gavins Point project, said crews will be working today and Sunday on removing vegetation on two sandbars about 10 miles downstream in the Missouri River where the birds nest. The Piping Plover and the Interior Least Tern build nests in the sandbars in the river.

• Toys, bottles and a porcelain jar were among the articles found during the third Fort Randall Archaeological Dig at the site of a former military outpost. The two-week dig last month involved 224 volunteers at the site of the first permanent Army fort settlement built in 1875 on the upper Missouri River.
