- A steam threshing bee will be held on the Lorell Sorensen farm six miles north, one mile west, and 1 1/2 miles north of Irene, starting at about 1:30 p.m. Sunday, September 15. Sorensen owns the shocked field of grain to be threshed, and owners and operator of the equipment are Art Swensen and Johie Lee. They have a Case 65 steam engine dating from about 1916 and a wooden Red River Special separator manufactured about 1909.
- The announcement that major auto manufacturers will install seat belts as standard equipment in 1964 model passenger cars drew praise Friday from Patrol Chief Cullen With. "We feel that a seat belt - when used - is a life-saver," With said.

KNOX CO. SHERIFF'S REPORT

Schramm Named Chamber Of Commerce Executive Director

Carmen Schramm has been named as the executive director of the Yankton Area Chamber of Commerce.

In a media release late Tuesday afternoon, Marcy Moser, president of the Chamber board of directors, made the announcement.

According to the release, the Chamber board has been working with the board of Yankton Area Progressive Growth (YAPG), a non-profit economic development corporation, on changes in how the organizations are structured. The discussion began with the departure last month of former Economic Development Director Mike Dellinger.

In addition to his economic development role, Dellinger served as executive director of the Chamber.

Meanwhile, Schramm served as the director of Chamber Services.

YAPG announced Monday

 **Schramm**

that it will integrate the Economic Development Council into its board, and it is believed the realignment of its relationship with the Chamber will also help form better partnerships that will strengthen investor relationships within both organizations.

"The discussions have been good, and the Chamber board of directors is pleased to be working with YAPG to make this a smooth transition for both groups and envisions the changes to be beneficial to both parties," Moser said.

Under the new structure, the executive director of the Chamber will be a voting member of YAPG, and the president of the Chamber will continue to be invited as a non-voting guest.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were mostly lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery rose 5.25 cents to \$6.4650 a bushel; December corn rose 5.50 cents to \$4.69 a bushel; December oats were 5 cents higher at \$3.1875 a bushel; while November soybeans fell 1.50 cents to \$13.55 a bushel.

Beef and pork prices were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

October live cattle fell .33 cent to \$1.2502 a pound; October feeder cattle was .28 cent lower at \$1.5777 a pound; while October lean hogs were .02 cent lower at \$.9085 a pound.
