Namely, utilize Hejna's talents. A week after catching three passes against Mitchell, Hejna had eight receptions for a school-record

209 yards in the Mountain time zone. He had touchdown receptions of 10 and 80 yards. Without having been in Rapid City for the game, all accounts had Strahl's improvements as the big story. He was sacked twice (a stat that isn't always the fault of the quarterback), but his decisions were

clearly better in his second start. The question now is, what's the next step in his progression?

With three consecutive Class 11AAA games coming up (Brandon Valley, Aberdeen Central and Sioux Falls O'Gorman), Strahl is naturally going to be tested. If the junior can come out of those games with consistent efforts that are light on mistakes, the Bucks are, yes, primed for something special.
