# Laughs Or Tears?

YCTC Presents 'Hydrangea Albright: Comedy Or Tragedy?' At MMC's Marian Auditorium

Rich Wright is making his directorial debut with the Yankton Children's Theatre Company next week, and his first play is a comedy — or a tragedy, depending on your point of view.

The play is, in fact, a comedy called "Hydrangea Albright: Comedy or Tragedy?' The show runs from Sept. 19-22 at Mount Marty College's Marian Auditorium. Showtimes are 7 p.m. Thursday through Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday. Admission is \$10 for adults, \$5 for children and free for children under 3.

Wright said he's excited about his first at-

tempt at directing.

"This is the first play I've ever directed,"

Wright said. "I've been in a number of performances over the last 10 years. I was really happy when they asked me to do this one.'

Wright has been involved with the Lewis and Clark Theatre Company for 10 years and acted in a show with the YCTC last year. He has also been involved with productions at Mount Marty College in the past.

YCTC Executive Director Allison Spark said the group is intended to help kids as well as get them interested in theater.

"Basically we're a company that tries to get kids into the arts," Spark said. "We want to get them up on stage to help them grow and mature into adults who can get in front

Wright said he was happy about the YCTC's decision to go with a comedy, but that

it can be a challenging genre to direct.

"When the (YCTC) asked me to direct this play, I was really glad it was a comedy because I think comedy is fun," he said. "But it's challenging to make people laugh. "There's so much timing involved in comedy, especially physical comedy, so it takes a lot of work to

get that down. The play centers around two dueling playwrights, played by Jennica Young (Comedic Playwright) and Blake Wieseler (Tragic Playwright), trying to write the same story about the cursed Hydrangea Albright, played by Ireland Biltoft, and a cast of oddball characters surrounding her. The playwrights attempt to write two different plays for her: One written as a tragedy and one written as a comedy and

Wright said he's enjoyed working with the

"These young performers are doing great," he said. "They're very enthusiastic. They all really want to learn about theater and I've got a bunch of little hams who really want to perform.

Twenty-three children ranging from 6 to 14 years old have been cast in the play and Wright said he was able to find roles for all of

Wright said shows like this give children many great opportunities.

"Theater is a life-long activity," he said. "The skills that you learn as far as self-confidence, speaking, projecting yourself, making a commitment to coming to practice every day, learning your lines and learning your entrances and exits, it's a big commitment. You learn a lot about responsibility and how to be committed to something and you learn a

lot of self-confidence." The next YCTC production will be "Bah, Humbug! Scrooge's Christmas Carol" in December. Spark said auditions for the show will be in October and more information will be coming out shortly.
