said. “We didn’t lose days to weather, so in that respect we got off to a good start. We’ve been able to decrease the timeline of the project by two to three months, so we’re getting the project done earlier.”  
Ekeren added that as a result of the faster construction time, the addition is also expected to come in under the allotted \$17 million budget.  
“We’re actually going to come in under budget by the time we’re through with the project,” he said. “Having the compression of time lessened the inconvenience to people and saves dollars as well, so that’s a nice combination to have.”  
Director of Public Relations Jay Gravholt also attributes this to the performance of many tasks with current Avera maintenance employees.  
“A lot of things that we had planned out for the contractors to do, our own in-house maintenance crew has taken ownership of that and done a lot in-house,” Gravholt said. “So we’ve saved a lot of money by using our own staff.”  
Ekeren estimates the Northern Lights is 75-80 percent complete, including some other smaller renovation projects that will begin as soon as the main addition is complete. This includes the hospital’s main conference room and a coffee shop. Ekeren said the reason for the delay on these smaller projects is to allow their counterparts in the new addition to become available for use. These additional renovations will take another 90-120 days, but impacts are expected to be minimal.  
Two departments that will have to make a large transition with Northern Lights coming online include the pharmacy and the laboratory. Ekeren said these moves will need to be well coordinated in order to minimize the impact on patients and staff.  
“When we have something like needing to make a move for a department, we have to figure out how we continue to provide serv-

ices,” Ekeren said. “Especially when — with the lab for example — you move a piece of very sensitive laboratory testing equipment from one place to the next, you’ve got to put that equipment through some tests to make certain that it still functions accurately before you start processing patient results. Then we have to figure out what we’ll do in the meantime for that test, whether there’s an alternative we can use or if we send it out for a brief period of time, or if it’ll be a matter of an hour or two before we can resume testing. We’ve got to go through that process for every one of the departments that needs to move so that we have the minimal disruption to our providers and out staff.”

Gravholt said he expects the transfer for the pharmacy section to go quickly. “The pharmacy is going to be moving on a Saturday night so it could happen as quickly as a day,” he said. “(There will be) very minimal effect on patients or staff.”

Gravholt expects the pharmacy move to occur at the end of the month while the lab will move in late October.

Ekeren said the hospital is planning open house events for the new spaces. He added that more information will be released regarding the open houses as the spaces are completed.

“As soon as we know more about the end points, then we can schedule some of those special events,” he said. “I would say by mid to late November, we hope to begin some of those events, but we have to see how the next 60 days of construction play out. All it takes is for one thing to not happen at the right point in time and it has a ripple effect on others and on the completion date.”

Gravholt said he believes the project has ultimately been worth the time and effort.

“We’re just all really excited for it to open up,” he said. “It’s been a long time coming and it seems with these projects, they’re all worth it when you get done.”
