Defending state champion Sioux Falls Lincoln had four of the top five scores on the way to a 10stroke boys' golf victory in a Thursday triangular at Yankton's Fox Run Golf Course.

The Patriots shot a 299, followed by Yankton (399) and Sioux Falls Washington (339).

Ben Prisbe of Lincoln edged two golfers for first place at 73, one shot in front of Yankton's Jace Guthmiller and Patriots teammate Lee Radke. The Lincoln duo of Tommy Vining and Cole Peterson both shot a 76.

Both the Aberdeen Central Golden Eagles and Yankton Bucks dug themselves a hole in their last outings, and with it the first halves of their seasons. Now, with identical 1-2 records, both teams are looking to get back to .500 to springboard into the second half of their seasons.

Aberdeen Central hosts the Bucks for the Golden Eagles' homecoming tonight (Friday), a 7 p.m. start at Swisher Field.

The Golden Eagles come in off a 32-13 loss to Watertown, leaving them ranked seventh in power points out of eight teams in 11AAA. Earlier this season, Aberdeen Central lost to Washington 19-17 and beat Brookings 28-12.


