Yankton Area Concert Association Ready To Kick Off Its 67th Season Sept. 29

hile this weekend marks the official beginning of the fall season, the Yankton Area Concert Association (YACA) is offering another chance to celebrate the "Green Leaves of Summer" later this month.

The YACA will kick off its 67th season when it hosts The Brothers Four at 7:30 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 29, at the YHS/Summit Activities Center Theatre.

Originally formed in 1957, the quartet was a pioneer in the "folk revival" musical movement. With hits such as "Yellow Bird," "Try to Remember," "Green Leaves of Summer" and "Greenfields," the group has played thousands of concerts, performed with symphony orchestras and entertained four U.S. presidents at the White House.

"The group has been around for 50 years," said YACA president Vi Ranney. "Of course, the members have changed in those years, but they still have the same sound."

The Brothers Four roster currently consists of Mike McCoy, Karl Olsen, Mark Pearson and founding member Bob Flick. The all-acoustic presentation set for Yankton will feature a blend of the four singers' voices, as well as guitars, banjo, mandolin and upright

"They have beautiful harmony," said YACA executive secretary Zita Hans. "It's very relaxing."

While The Brothers Four performance will be one to remember, that's just the beginning, Hans added.

The opening concert is going to give people a good taste of what's going to come down the road because we have some spec-

tacular groups for the rest of the season," she said.

Following The Brothers Four will be a performance by classical pianist Charlie Albright on Oct. 23.

In addition to his solo concerts, Albright has performed with numerous symphonies and cellist Yo-Yo Ma. He has been critically acclaimed by many prominent news sources, including The Washington Post and The New York Times.

"What he can do on a piano is just amazing," Hans said. "He plays everything from classical to pop tunes. He covers the gamut, and it's just beautiful."

The concert series continues Nov. 5 with "Long Live the King," a tribute to Nat King Cole by the Allan Harris Band, followed by "Thank You for the Music — A Modern Tribute to ABBA" on Feb. 23, 2014.

On April 22, 2014, the YACA will host the Unexpected Surfer Boys, who will offer a tribute to the Beach Boys.
"They're awesome," Hans said. "We've

had them here before and we brought them back because everybody loved them.

The concert series wraps up May 13, 2014, with a performance by the Rodney Mack Philadelphia Big Brass.

'We have a nice mixture of classical, pop

and brass orchestra," Hans said. "The music we've picked up this year should please the

ears of anyone that comes to the concerts.' Added Ranney, "These are real artists and professional entertainers who have thrilled audiences everywhere. Come enjoy the presence of live performers on the stage.
