College football saw several one-sided games on Saturday, even games where a rolling clock and a shortened fourth quarter were used to keep things from getting further out of hand.

Even though South Dakota State's game with Nebraska — a 59-20 Cornhusker victory — would probably be one of those games thrown into that category, the sixth-ranked team in FCS wasn't in Lincoln, Neb., just to pick up a paycheck and take their beating.

In fact, they were not happy with the outcome of a game they led 17-14 in the first quarter.

"I am disappointed in our performance today, we have to get in to the film room and make sure we 'right' some things," SDSU head coach John Stiegelmeier said after the game. "Very disappointed for our guys to not come down and play a better football game as a football team and give ourselves a chance to have a better result on the field."

SDSU players that spoke to the media after the game gave similar comments, reflecting that they

didn't come to Lincoln as "tourists," as Stiegelmeier put it during the post-game presser, but as a team focused on winning.

The offense looked like it, especially early, as SDSU matched the Huskers score-for-score in the first quarter and saw star running back Zach Zenner break the 200-yard mark yet again. But Zenner wasn't willing to put it all on his teammates on the defense.

"You know we started shooting ourselves in the foot a little bit. We were down deep and had that offensive pass interference, then the false start and then the sacks. I felt like we really started hurting ourselves," he said.

If you're a fan of SDSU, that's what you want to see, especially with top-ranked and two-time defending FCS champion North Dakota State coming to town next. If you're a fan of another team, that's the kind of attitude you hope to see out of your team.

There's an old saying in sports: "Respect all, fear none." It's something that SDSU has made a part of its mantra, and something that will help keep them among the top teams in the country.
