**75 YEARS AGO**  
**Friday, September 30, 1938**  
 • A revision of the motor fuel tax laws was recommended by J. E. Adrian, manager of the motor fuel tax division, in his annual report to State Treasurer W. H. Hinselman. Adrian said that from experience gained in the enforcement of the motor fuel tax and inspection laws, "We believe that an attempt should be made to the collection and refunding of the gasoline tax and inspection of petroleum products into one office under the state treasurer."  
 • Entertainment features are being added to Fall Festival week with indications that the celebration this year is to be the largest and most complete yet held, and if weather is favorable, the crowd is expected to be the largest of any previous year.

**50 YEARS AGO**  
**Monday, September 30, 1963**  
 • Four men from this area enlisted in the U. S. Navy through CS1 Verne L. Hanson, local recruiter, between September 20 and September 26. William Louis Neuhalfen, Yankton, enlisted September 20; Anthony Charles Buehlmann, Yankton, enlisted September 20; Gerald Lloyd Hausman, Yankton, enlisted September 26; and Leon Joseph Steffen, Wakonda, enlisted September 26.  
 • Frost-free South Dakota now appears likely to stay that way well into at least the first week in October. High temperatures Sunday were from 71 at Watertown and Sioux Falls to 81 at Philip.

**25 YEARS AGO**  
**Friday, September 30, 1988**  
 • One significant change that goes into effect for this year's high school students is the change in high school graduation requirements. High school students must now carry at least five classes per day to graduate with the required 20 classroom hours, Yankton School District superintendent Maurice Haugland said.  
 • Jack Ricardson was presented a plaque in recognition of the many years of service he has provided to the Yankton school system as activities director, by the Yankton Quarterback Club. Presenting the plaque was the club's Head Coach Scott Shindler. Richardson will be retiring at the end of this school year.

Area Man Wins Federal Stamp Contest

SIoux FALLS (AP) — A South Dakota artist is the winner of the 2013 federal duck stamp contest.  
 Adam Grimm, of Burbank, placed first in the annual U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service art contest. There were 202 entries.  
 Grimm's oil painting of a canvasback will be made into the 2014-15 federal duck stamp, which will go on sale in late June 2014.  
 The stamp sells for \$15 and raises about \$25 million each year to help conserve and protect wetlands.  
 It's the second time that Grimm, an Ohio native, has won the contest. His art previously appeared on the 2000-01 federal duck stamp.  
 The results were announced Saturday. Hoyt Smith of Tulsa, Okla., placed second and Ron Louque, of Charlottesville, Va., finished third.
