forced a Kernel safety. "We needed to grow some confidence with the offensive line," Van Overschelde said. "That really makes a big difference and did." After the safety, with a 16-0 lead, Fitzgerald returned the kick deep into Mitchell territory. "We did pretty good on winning the position battle," Likness said. "For the most part we had good field position. We need more confidence and not be riverboat gamblers on special teams." Strahl found Hale on a fade route in the corner of the end zone. Yankton, who only had 47 total yards at half, was able to head to the half with a very comfortable 23-0 lead. "We didn't execute as well as we should have," Likness said. "We came out in the second half and played better. There are a lot of things we

can do to clean up our game." Yankton received the ball at the half. They marched down, with key receptions from Strahl to Fitzgerald and Sheldon Gant. The Bucks scored on a quarterback sneak from Strahl, which annied their lead to 30-2. Hats off to Yankton, they did a great job and made the plays when they needed to," Van Overschelde said. "All the big plays went there way today." Later in the third quarter, Mitchell got on the board with a safety play. The fourth quarter, the Bucks were able to play some reserves, which gave them quality experience and rest for starters. Likness was happy he got to get his players experience, but knows he expects more from them. "You have to give Mitchell credit," he said. "They took a lot away from us. We were able to pick away and find a way to get it done. Our offense wasn't really clicking in the first half, but in the third quarter we somewhat found

a running and passing game. But, made the plays when we had to." Yankton was able to hold onto a commanding 30-2 victory, the first for the Buck seniors in their tenure in red and white, in their inaugural game of the 2014 campaign. Yankton had 147 total yards of offense. Mason Strahl led the Bucks offensively with 76 yards, on seven completions, with two touchdowns. He also added a rushing touchdown in the contest. Tanner Frick had 127 all-purpose yards, with 60 of them coming from punt returns. The Buck defense only gave up 101 total yards to the Kernels. Nelson and Spencer Neugabauer combined to rush the ball 40 times for 56 total yards. "They got after it," Likness said. "We got everyone in the game who dressed. It was a win, but we weren't happy with how we did it. We will have to go back and really figure out what we need to do to get better." Yankton's next opponent, Rapid City Stevens, was defeated 34-7 to Sioux Falls O'Gorman last Friday night. The Bucks will look to

"He's a really special player, and time will bear that out." Mariota, a native of Hawaii, completed 14-of-20 passes for 267 yards and three touchdowns, and also rushed for 43 yards and a score. And all of that without playing a snap after halftime. Mariota engineered the Ducks to two touchdowns on their first seven plays from scrimmage, and on the third drive marched them 97 yards for another touchdown. In all, Oregon scored on six of its seven possessions in the first half, building a 41-3 cushion. What did the Coyotes think of Mariota? "I thought we'd be able to get on him a little faster," junior linebacker Colin Buscarini said. "He had good pocket awareness and was able to sneak out of some things." "He had a good game, and he was able to do a lot of things he wanted to do." Mariota's backup, Jeff Lockie, was just as effective, completing 11-of-12 passes

for 113 yards and a touchdown in the second half. The Ducks added three more touchdowns after halftime — on a punt return, a Lockie pass and a scoring run. In all, Oregon rolled up 673 yards of total offense on 70 plays, for an average of 9.6 yards per play. "They were fast; the fastest team we'll probably ever go up against," USD junior linebacker Keyen Lage said. "They just don't mess up." "That's the thing about them. They're amazing athletes, but they're consistent in what they do every play."

The Coyotes open their home schedule with a Saturday contest against NALA member William Penn (Iowa). Kickoff is 2 p.m. at the DakotaDome. William Penn beat Bethel (Tennessee) 52-13 in its season opener this past Saturday. The Statesmen ran on 72 of their 79 offensive plays and rolled up 557 yards of total offense.
