5,000 books and countless recording. The NMM was founded in 1973 and is a non-profit entity.

Viewers of the Google Cultural Institute website can currently see 72 instruments done with brilliant photography. Some of these instruments include NMM favorites such as the oldest cello in existence, the Amati "King," the "Harrison" Stradivari violin and the earliest and still playable harpsichord.

The Google website allows the viewers to zoom into the exhibit and receive a better view than a visitor would actually receive at the museum. At the official launch, Google spokesperson Wolete Moko, a musician himself, demonstrated Google's photography by focusing on two new features on the Google Cultural Institute website: The King Cello, and the many NMM his-

power plant for a total of 44,000," he said. "We anticipate staying that way through the first part of December, depending on the weather."

Moving the excess water will allow the Corps to extend the navigation season 10 days, Farhat said. In addition, it will provide higher winter releases, which the Corps says will benefit winter hydropower generation and reduce risks to water intakes during periods of ice formation this winter.

"By evacuating the excess water from the reservoir system at the lowest possible rate for the longest period of time, the updated release plan will properly prepare the reservoir system for next year's runoff season, while reducing downstream flood risk this fall," she explained.

The excess water shouldn't create flooding issues, Farhat said.

"Although releases are higher than normal for this time of year, flows are expected to remain in the channel unless we experience a significant amount of rain," she added.

The Corps will carefully monitor downstream conditions and adjust Gavins Point Dam releases as necessary this fall to reduce flooding risks and to continue moving stored flood water.

newspaper and radio ads and for posters.

The newsletter for example offers samples of Facebook and Twitter posts that businesses can use.

The lottery also recently

hired a new sales representative. Marla Gruber was a long-time KELO TV sales person and was general sales manager since 2004, according to Norm Lingle, the lottery's executive director.

"We're excited to have Marla on board. I think with her past history she can be a huge benefit to the Lottery," he said.

Two other changes of late were the hiring in the past year of business analyst John Keyes, who recently completed an in-depth look at video-lottery trends, and the departure last month of Deb Reese, who had been director of security and video lottery since November 2004. The lottery is taking applications for her replacement.

North Dakota and northwest South Dakota." The August rainfall was 200 percent of normal for the upper basin above Sioux City.

As a result, the 2014 runoff as of Sept. 1, stood at 35.6 MAF or 141 percent of normal above Sioux City and 32.7 MAF or 142 percent of normal above Gavins Point dam.

The September runoff is forecast to be 1.9 MAF or 170 percent of normal, with 1.6 MAF of that occurring in the Fort Peck, Garrison and Oahe reaches.

Moving water during the fall is the usual practice, with the releases often surpassing 40,000 cfs, Farhat said.

"It's a very good time of the year to evacuate flood water from the system. We do it routinely," she said.

The record August rainfalls greatly compressed the available time for moving water, Farhat said.

"With the volume of water we are planning to evacuate this fall, we have only 90 days to it from now to early December. To move that volume of water, we need to increase releases by 17,000 to get it to 45,000," she said.

"If this would have happened the first of May, we would have had six months to evacuate this water. The releases would have needed to go up only half as much."
