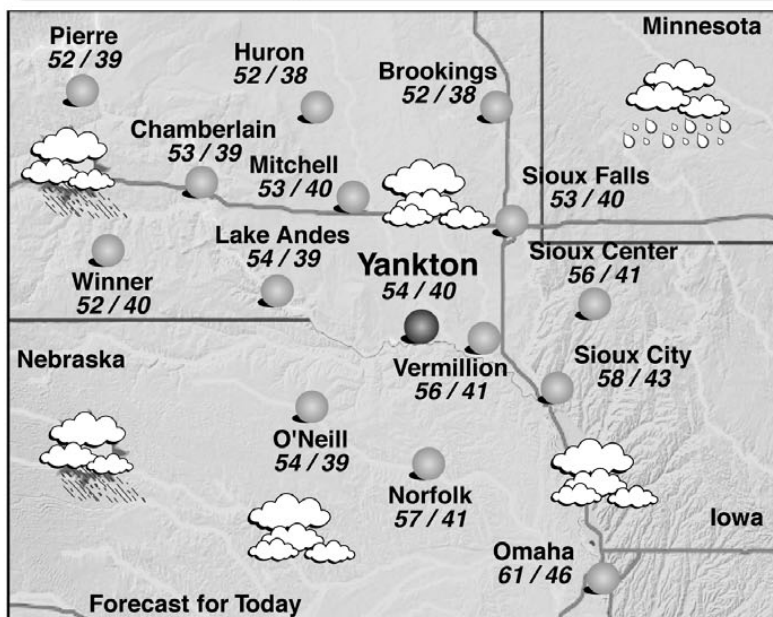

**Hazardous Waste Collection Events Set**

Household Hazardous Waste Collection will be held on Friday, Sept. 12, for Vermillion residents (2-6 p.m.) and Saturday, Sept. 13, in Yankton (9 a.m.-1 p.m.). There is a \$10 fee per vehicle to help defray the collection cost. This collection provides opportunities for residents to safely dispose of products containing harmful chemicals. Unless used and disposed of according to directions, these household chemicals present a threat to the environment. Special handling is required to dispose of them properly. Materials collected are recycled, or disposed in hazardous waste landfills or incinerators. A licensed private company under contract to the Missouri Valley Recycling Center provides these services.

LINCOLN, Neb. — People diagnosed with serious mental health and substance abuse conditions die decades earlier than the general population due to conditions like diabetes, high blood pressure and cardiovascular disease, according to the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration. "But wellness is more than just physical," said Scot L. Adams, director of the Division of Behavioral Health at the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services. "Wellness means overall well-being. It's having a healthy body, living environment, quality relationships, resiliency, happiness and a purpose in life." "People with a behavioral health condition can take steps toward total wellness," said Carol Coussons de Reyes, administrator of the DHHS Office of Consumer Affairs. "Exercise, a good diet, meditation, art, spending more time with family and friends—all these things can have a positive impact." **BOARD OF TRADE**

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for Dec delivery fell 6 cents to \$5.2750 a bushel; Dec corn was 4 cents lower at 3.4425 a bushel; Dec oats were 2 cents higher at \$3.49 a bushel; while Nov soybeans declined 15.75 cents to \$9.9975 a bushel. Beef and pork were higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. Oct live cattle rose 1.15 cents to \$1.5967 a pound; Oct feeder cattle was 1.83 cent higher at \$2.2775 a pound; while Oct lean hogs gained 2.70 cents to \$1.0577 a pound.
