"Wellness means overall well-being. It's having a healthy body, living environment, quality relationships, resiliency, happiness and a purpose in life."

"People with a behavioral health condition can take steps toward total wellness," said Carol Coussons de Reyes, ad-ministrator of the DHHS Office of Consumer Affairs. "Exercise, a good diet, meditation, art, spending more time with family and friends—all these things can have a positive impact.
